2 bunches (about 10) small beets
2 carrots
1 onion, grated
2 quarts water
2 teaspoons salt
juice of 1 lemon
1 tablespoon sugar (about)
sour cream

Peel and shred beets and carrots. Add the onion and cook, uncovered in salted water until tender (about 25 minutes). Add lemon juice and sugar. Simmer 10 minutes longer. Remove from flame and chill thoroughly. Garnish with 1 tablespoon sour cream for each serving. Serves 8.

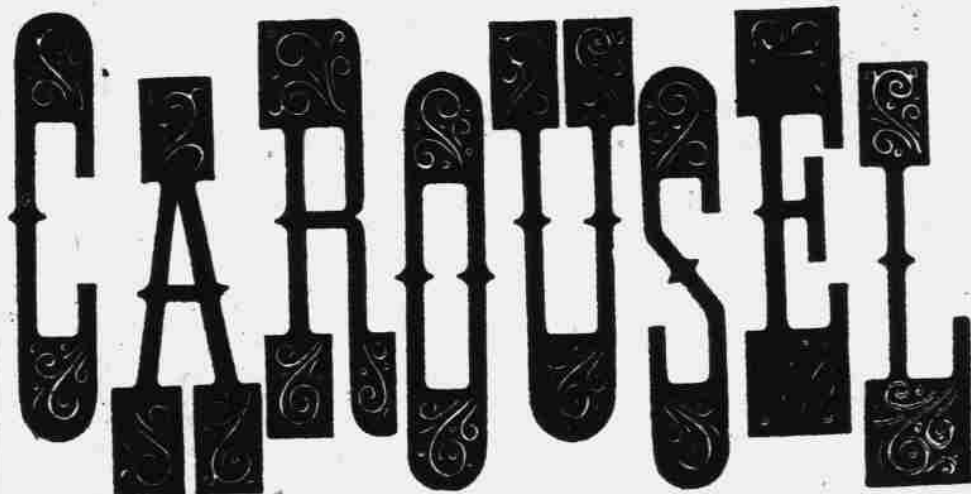
