Goldberg for President

Some five years ago -- if memory serves us rightly -- the Union of American Hebrew Congregations conducted a survey on the future of Jewish life in America, particularly as it would look by the end of this century. Among the highlights of the survey were expressions of belief by many prominent Americans that a Jew would be Vice President of the United States before the end of the 20th century.

At the time the prediction seemed remote. True enough, Jews had entered the mainstream of American life and were being accepted in greater measure not only in the large enclaves of the country, but even in the humble hamlets of our national climate. Yet it seemed improbable at the time that an American electorate that up to then had never elected a Catholic to highest office would now vote a Jew into a chair of dignity and power.

But the years evidently move swifter in the space age. What seemed impossible then is no longer so.

At the time the thought of a Jewish Vice President by the end of the century seemed fantasy, a dream unadulterated and pure. Now however the climate is such that a Catholic paper -- America -- has even suggested the possibility of a Jewish President in our lifetime -- Ambassador Arthur J. Goldberg.

We are not quite sure whether America is right in its prognostication. In fact we cannot conceive the suggestion coming from Jewish editorial pages.

But we would be less than honest if we did not admit that we are tickled by the daring imagination of America's editors.

WASHINGTON (WNS) A strong verbal protest against alleged U.S. interference in the situation of Soviet Jewry was made here by Alexander I. Zinchuk, Counselor to the Soviet Embassy.

The Soviet official presented his government's views in a call he made on Richard H. Davis, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European Affairs. Mr. Zinchuk protested against what he called U.S. Government "attempts to interfere in the domestic affairs of the USSR."

Triggering the representation was recent disclosure that the State Department had abandoned opposition to a proposed Congressional resolution - sponsored by Sen-

ator Abraham Ribicoff of Connecticut and endorsed by sixty-three other members of the Senate - condemning Soviet anti-Semitism.
