Only in rare instances are adequate religious facilities provided for this growing mass of college and university population. Our own Nevada Southern University is one of the worst cases in point. Her students and faculty members have not a single "Hillel" director or rabbi giving his full attention to their religious and other Jewish needs! It should be the highest priority on the agenda of our communal

Each year our concern in- leaders, especially those in Las Vegas, to remedy this critical deficiency at the earliest possible moment. П

Our students away-fromhome are often much better situated. Special holiday and Shabbat services are arranged for them by their "Hillel" rabbis, who also serve as an important resource for counseling students with their personal and spiritual problems. Furthermore, these campus rabbis act as a liaison with the Jewish com-

I urge every student member of our Temple family to get to know your "Hillel" rabbi. If there is none, introduce yourself to the rabbi (s) of the local community. Make arrangements to attend services on a regular basis and to have occasional meals

The happy holidays are cause for rejoicing. Let us examine the reasons for celebration on some of these occasions and determine for ourselves whether they measure in impact with the Vatican declaration.

According to the Columbia Encyclopedia, Succoth is celebrated as the place where Israelites made their first camp at their exodus from Egypt. Passover is commemorated for the deliverance of the Jews from the yoke of Egypt: Purim commemorates the deliverance of the Persian Jews from a general massacre. Hanukkah is celebrated because Jewish soldiers victoriously entered Jerusalem, removed the idolatrous objects from the Temple and kindled the perpetual light that miraculously burned for eight days. This was 164 years before the Christian era.

There would be no detraction in our belief in our God if one more date of exultation were added to our calendar. In one man's humble opinion, that date took place this very month.

We are entitled to it. We deserve it. We hope and pray our leaders will review and mark it properly so that we may rejoice in our deliverance from anti-Semitism.
