RECIPE

Cold Cherry Soup
 1 No.3 can tart pitted cherries
 1 quart water
 1/4 cup sugar
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 stick cinnamon
 1 tablespoon cornstarch
 1/2 cup sour cream

Boil cherries, water, sugar, salt, and cinnamon for 10 minutes. Make a thin paste of cornstarch and 1/4 cup cold water. Slowly add the paste to the boiling cherries. Continue to boil for 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Remove cinnamon and chill thoroughly. Stir in sour cream just before serving. Serves 6.
