STOCK DIVIDENDS

The Board of Directors of Southwest Gas Corporation voted Monday (October 25) to increase the dividend on the common stock by 33-1/3%. The dividends will be raised from 15¢ to 20¢ per share quarterly.

The first dividend at the new rate will be paid December 1, 1965 to shareholders of record November 10, 1965.

W.M. Laub, president of Southwest Gas Corporation, stated that the 33-1/3% increase was prompted by the favorable business outlook and the utility's policy of periodically increasing dividends as justified by earnings. In June, 1964, dividends were also raised one-third.

The natural gas firm, reported to be one of the nation's fastest growing utilities, serves approximately 56,000 customers. The Las Vegas based company serves Northern and Southern Nevada, as well as areas in California and Arizona.

In the five year period since 1960, Southwest Gas operating revenues have increased from \$7,289,000 to \$22,500,000. Utility plant has grown from \$13,755,000 to \$59,000,000 and total gas sales have increased from 9,915,000 to 36,500,000 m.c. f. (thousand cubic feet).

The utility continued its expansion into new areas throughout 1965. In January, Southwest Gas completed a new transmission line into Big Bear, California, and has been constructing distribution and service lines to new customers.

In early spring, a transmission line was completed eastward to Elko, Nevada and another pipeline is currently under construction to serve the North Shore of Lake Tahoe.

Value of Orthodoxy

NEW YORK (WNS) Orthodox Judaism today represents "the only remaining vestige of Jewish passion" in the United States, with one of every six American Jews considering himself Orthodox.

This is the thesis of a lead article in the just released 66th annual edition of the American Jewish Year Book by Charles S. Liebman, Assistant Professor of Political Science at Yeshiva University.

Considered one of the most positive and comprehensive reports ever to appear on Orthodox Judaism in a publication in this country, the study contradicts earlier predictions of the demise of Orthodoxy.

Prepared by the American Jewish Committee, the Year Book is published jointly by the Committee and the Jewish Publication Society of America.

Dealing with the Orthodox upsurge, the writer notes that while "its inner core is growing in numbers and financial strength" as the movement "is experiencing a greater sense of confidence and purpose," its "ultimate direction and form are still undermined."

Prof. Liebman estimates that a total of 205,640 men are affiliated with the 1,603 known Orthodox synagogues in the United States and that as many as a third of the Jews who consider themselves Orthodox are not affiliated with any congregation. Coming up with an average figure of 3.3 for all Jewish families and a figure of 5,660,000 for the current Jewish population in the United States, the writer deducts that probably as many as 1,000,000 Americans now constitute the Orthodox segment. In this estimate, he allows for the fact that Orthodox families are traditionally larger than those of other segments of Judaism. The Reform Judaism ratio is 3.5, and the Conservative 4.5. He gives no figures on the total numbers in Orthodox families.

Another touchstone in Orthodox burgeoning, Professor Liebman says, is the remarkable growth of yeshivot, particularly in the last twenty-five years. One of his most significant findings is disclosure of a definitive tendency among Orthodoxy toward concern with the rest of the community. Concluding, Dr. Liebman observes that old antagonisms to the world of Orthodoxy are gone from many intellectuals further removed from Orthodoxy and that "there is a recognition and admiration for Orthodoxy as the only group which today contains within it a strength and will to live that may yet nourish all the Jewish world."

Jewish Population

The Year Book estimates the world Jewish population at the end of 1964 at 13,216,000, with the U.S. holding 5,660,000, the Soviet Union 2,454,000 and Israel 2,244,700. Of the total number of Jews in the U.S. some 2,518,175 were centered in New York State, and of those about 1,836,000 resided in New York City.

South America was reported to have a Jewish population of 689,950, some 450,000 of them living in Argentina, with 300,000 in Buenos Aires.

Other areas with large concentrations of Jews were France with 500,000, Great Britain with 450,000, Canada with 267,000, Rumania with 140,000, South Africa with 116,000, Morocco with 85,000, Hungary with 80,000, Iran with 80,000 and Australia with 67,000.

Another survey in the Year Book discloses that increasing numbers of West Germans are expressing opposition to the prosecution of the Nazi war trials. Some 53% of the Germans interviewed considered it proper to hold such trials, but 39% were found to register strong opposition on the alleged ground that "one should not stir up these things after so many years."

A public opinion survey last year showed that 63% of the men and 76% of the women interviewed were against continuation of the Nazi trials.

The author of the report, West German educator Professor Hans Lamm, found that "although anti-Semitism and nazism were officially taboo, nationalist tendencies were sometimes easily awakened" in West Germany by "periodicals appealing to nationalist groups and emotions."
