## RECIPE

Sour-cream Almond Cookies

- 3 eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup sour cream
- 4 cups sifted flour
- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 cup almonds, finely chopped
- granulated sugar

Beat eggs. Add sugar gradually, continuing beating until creamy. Stir in vanilla and sour cream. Sift together flour and baking powder. Add nuts and mix well. Add dry ingredients to the egg mixture, mixing thoroughly. Roll dough to 1/8-inch thickness and sprinkle with sugar. Cut with a cookie cutter. Bake at 425 degrees for 15 mins.
