Among his many friends, were oldtimers like Tom Mix and Jack Hoxi. The most stabilized period was a full year in Oklahoma City, but the ties of his hometown were strong and he returned to New Mexico to work for five years on the local ran-

THAT JEWISH VOTE By Robert Appel

As far as a pair of experienced observers are concerned, there most certainly is a Jewish vote -- at least in New York's bubbling ethnic kettle -- and its exercise is an indicator of the conflicts of Jewish adjustment to the open society of modern times.

That is the way it looks to Pat Moynihan, a brilliant government career man who made a spectacular but unsuccessful bid for the Mayoralty nomination in the Democratic primary in New York last September; and to Nathan Glazer, a sociologist who has written many penetrating studies of Jewish life in modern America.

The two experts have evaluated Jewish voting response among New York's ethnic groups in a study entitled, "Beyond the Melting Pot." Their report sees the Jewish vote as primarily an "ideological," rather than a party or ethnic act. Jews are moved, as are other groups, by issues which primarily affect them, such as United States policy toward Israel. However, the two experts report, it is practically impossible to test the effect of pro-Israel stances of candidates on Jewish voters, because all political candidates for office in New York and in other large cities of the country, automatically profess "an enthusiasm for Israel." Similarly, it is hard to test the truth of the presumed axiom that a Jewish candidate automatically gets a large number -- perhaps a majority -- of ballots from Jewish voters simply because he is a Jew.

The fact seems to be, the experts say, that ethnic tendencies in voting express-

ed "the entire culture and traditions of the group." Specifically, in the case of New York Jews, the vote is an affirmation of support of "liberalism" but, in the affluent society of America, that proposition raises the question of how the yardstick applies and the basic impulses that are manifested.
