

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

COPENHAGEN (WNS) Yehuda Aray Levin, Israeli Ambassador to Denmark since 1961 died here of a heart attack at the age of 58. The deceased was a former Counsellor to the Israel Embassy in Washington. Born in South Africa, he settled in Palestine in 1927.

CHICAGO (WNS) Cantor Maurice Roamn of Temple Isaiah Israel has been invited to perform services on the nineteenth of this month at Temple Choral, the main synagogue of Budapest, Rumania. The invitation was extended by Dr. Mosses Rosen, Chief Rabbi and president of the Jewish Federation of Rumania.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Premier Levi Eshkol is contemplating to enlarge his present sixteen-man Cabinet to eighteen members, according to press reports here which said the new Cabinet would consist of ten Mapai members, three Achdut Avodah representatives, two Mapam members and one Independent Liberal.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Former Premier David Ben Gurion is to visit the United States next February, where he is to deliver a series of lectures under the auspices of the American-Israel Bible Society.

BONN (WNS) West Germany will do all in its power to bring to justice all Nazi war criminals before the expiration of the extended statute of limitations in 1969, Chancellor Ludwig Erhard declared in the Bundestag.

GREENFIELD PARK, N.Y. (WNS) An appeal for an "all-out offensive" against what he called the "new Judaism" was sounded here by Rabbi Morris Sherer, executive vice president of Agudath Israel of America. Addressing the 43rd national convention of the organization, Rabbi Sherer said that the "new Judaism" was a "deviate from tradition" and "creating a Jewish people in name but not in substance."

JERUSALEM (WNS) Categorical denial that he had been a member of the Nazi party in Hungary, the Arrow Cross, was made by Dr. Alexander Toerock, chief Counsellor of the West German Embassy in Israel.

LONDON (WNS) A warning that "divisions between the lay and religious sectors" in the Anglo-Jewish community appeared to be widening was sounded at a meeting of the B'nai B'rith District Lodge of Great Britain and Ireland.

PARIS (WNS) Reorganization of the Fonds Social Juif Unifie along the general lines of a Board of Jewish Deputies was counselled here this week by Baron Guy de Rothschild at a meeting of the organization. He suggested that the new body act as a "parliament" for the entire French Jewish community.

WEST BERLIN (WNS) Five hundred exhibits from the Jewish Museum in Prague were put on display at the West Berlin Jewish Community Center for official opening on September 1. Included in the display are religious objects from the Old Prague Synagogue.
