Vietnam Gifts For Hanukkah

NEW YORK -- Hanukkah parties for Jewish servicemen with the U.S. Armed Forces in Vietnam, like those to be held at all American military installations throughout the world and at Veterans Administration hospitals in the United States, will be made brighter by gifts, holiday supplies and treats shipped by local groups in the United States affiliated with the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB) Women's Organizations' Services. More than 50,000 gift-wrapped packages will be in the hands of Jewish personnel in the the name of the American Jewish community when the first Hanukkah candle, marking the eight-day Festival of Lights, is kindled after sundown Saturday, December 18.

Hundreds of gifts, including Jewish books, records, silver mezuzot and Stars of David on chains, as well as refreshments, are on their way to Chaplains Richard E. Dryer, Robert Louis Reiner and Harry Z. Schreiner, the three Jewish chaplains in Vietnam, for distribution during Hanukkah to the growing number of Jewish military personnel in that a-
