\$150,000 to build six new School Prayer Ban Extended

American Jewish Congress took a public stand, on the eve of Chanukah week, that Yule and Chanukah programs in public schools were WASHINGTON (WNS) The Supreme Court extended its ban on prayer in public schools to include voluntary recitation of prayers in nursery classes.

The High Court did so by allowing a lower federal court ban to stand. The Supreme Court stand was hailed by the United Parents Association, the Public Education Association and the New YorkCivil Liberties Union.

The Supreme Court ruling was considered the furthest extension of the school prayer ban since the Court held in 1962 that state-composed prayers were unconstitutional. A year later, the High Court banned state require ment for class room recitation of the Lord's Prayer and devotional Bible read-
