JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (WNS) Israel had by July of this year turned over a total of 3,588,008 pounds sterling (\$9,046,422) from blocked accounts belonging to Arab refugees and absentee owners according to a report issued here by the Palestine Conciliation Commission.

NEW YORK (WNS) The establishment of "Combined Refugee Commissions," to be composed of representatives of the Arab refugees and Israel under the aegis of the United Nations, was urged by Dr. Simon Shereshevsky, of Jerusalem, chairman of the Ihud Association of Jerusalem, an organization advocating Arab-Israel reconciliation. The proposed commissions, according to Dr. Shereshevsky, would be a "first step" toward solution of the Arab refugee problem.

DALLAS (WNS) Members of the American Nazi party and guests at an Israel Bonds Dinner exchanged blows at the Statler Hilton Hotel here.

NEW YORK: The Authoritarian Personality, pioneering study on the nature of prejudice sponsored fifteen years ago by the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, has just been published in Spanish by Editorial Proyeccion, Argentine publishers, according to word received here from the Committee's office in Buenos Aires.

NEW YORK: The decision by West Germany to defer \$100,000,000 in indemnification payments to Nazi victims over the next two years was denounced by the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE as putting "mere budgetary considerations above moral issues."

PARIS, Helmut Cramer, publisher of pro-Nazi literature who fled to Egypt from West Germany last March while on trial for disseminating anti-democratic propaganda, is now sending out his books from Cairo where he has re-established his neo-Nazi publishing house, Zachariah Shuster, European Director of the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE revealed.

NEW YORK: Integration, both at the school and the college level, and the tireless defense of our cultural pluralism, are two of the most pressing problems faced today in our city and our nation, according to Dr. Buell Gallagher, President of The City College of New York.

NEW YORK: The YM and YWHA of Jerusalem, now under construction, should be ready for occupancy in the Spring of 1967, according to Sollel Boneh, Israel's largest building contractor.

NEW YORK: The extreme right in France received a severe setback in the recent Presidential election and seems to pose no real problem today although it still possesses nuisance value and of course must be watched according to a report on the election received from the European headquarters of the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE in Paris.

NEW YORK: About 100 Books, an evaluation of new books for young readers from pre-school to teen-agers and for their teachers which touch upon the important issues of our time, has just been published by the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, pioneering human relations agency in this country.

NEW YORK: A committee of the United Nations General Assembly has adopted, by a vote of 67 to 0, with 10 abstentions, a resolution requesting the Human Rights Commission to "study in all its aspects" the proposal for a United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and to report back to the Assembly's next session.

The idea of a United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights was first proposed by Jacob Blaustein, Baltimore industrialist and former United States delegate to the UN, in his 1963 Dag Hammarskjold Memorial Lecture delivered at Columbia University. Mr. Blaustein, Honorary President of the American Jewish Committee, helped to draft the Human Rights provisions in the UN Charter in San Francisco in 1945, in association with Judge Joseph M. Proskauer, also an Honorary President.

BROOKLYN, N.Y. (WNS) Vandals broke into the Shaari Israel Synagogue for the third time this year. Prayer books were torn, talises ripped and records destroyed.
