Late News Briefs

TEL AVIV (WNS) Premier Eshkol was reported ready to present a new coalition government to Parliament next week after breaking the deadlock in prolonged negotiations with the National Religious Party.

TEL AVIV (WNS) The United States, Britain, France and the Soviet Union were called on to join together in guaranteeing the territorial integrity and sovereignty of the nations of the Middle East. The call was issued by Israel's Deputy Prime Minister Abba Eben who said that as matters stand in the region at the present time, a four-power doctrine in the Middle East is needed to ensure Israel's continued existence.

CHICAGO (WNS) Funeral services were held for Florence C. Heller, the noted philanthropist and president of the National Jewish Welfare Board who died here at the age of 68.

Murders at Treblinka

BONN (WNS) Three former Nazis went on trail in West Germany on charges of being responsible for the wartime murders of several thousand Jews in Czenstochow, in occupied Poland.

The defendants: Paul Degenhardt, 70, former Nazi police officer; Kurt Jericho, 57, now a businessman; and Otto Loebel, 51 a law court guard, are charged with deporting thousands of Jews to the Treblinka death camp and with participation in many individual acts of murder.

In another development concerning a Nazi war criminal, it was reported that the Swiss Government is now examining Germany's request the extradition of Erhard Kroeger, a former SS

officer, who was arrested in Switzerland.

at a war crimes trial in Wuppertal after being assured of a safe conduct from his home in Italy to the trial and back again. He was arrested by Interpol at Zurich where he had stopped in Zurich he violated the terms of his safe conduct.

Germany has accused Kroeger of being personally responsible for the murder of over 3,000 Jews and mentally ill persons in Lembrug, Poland in 1941.

On Stuttgart the trial of 10 former Nazis charged with murdering Jews in Tarnopol, Galicia, during the Nazi occupation was resumed. They jury will hear several witness from abroad.

Few NY Bank Execs

NEW YORK (WNS) Disclosure that fifty mutual savings banks in New York City were systematically excluding Jews from top-management and policy-making positions was made by the American Jewish Committee when it released the results of a survey it made of the situation.

Made public at a press conference by Theodore Ellenoff, chairman of the Civil Rights Committee of the agency's New York Chapter, the report revealed that no Jewish executive officers were found in 60 per cent of the banks. The survey showed that of the more than 400 executive officers and 750

trustees of these banks, less than 3% were identified as Jewish although Jews make up one-quarter of New York City's population and are obviously prominent in the city's life.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A two hour exchange of fire between Jordanian troops and Israeli border patrols was reported here by Army officials who said there were no Israeli casualties.

The shooting, in the Gilboa frontier region, was launched by Jordanian troops who aimed their fire on an Israeli police jeep patrolling the border.

Outstanding Jewish personalities, one of them a United States Senator, the other two the executive heads of the two major beneficiary agencies of the United Jewish Appeal, have been added to the roster of prominent speakers scheduled to address the 11th Annual United Jewish Appeal Western Region Leadership Conference to be held over the weekend of January 28-30, 1966 at the Hotel Del Coronado in Coronado, California. They are Senator Abraham Ribicoff of Connecticut, the former Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare in President Kennedy's Cabinet; Gottlieb Hammer, Executive Vice-Chairman of the Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc. and President of the American Israeli Shipping Company; and Charles H. Jordan, Director-General of the Joint Distribution Committee.

Previously it had been announced that Israel Ambassador Avraham Harman, UJA General Chairman Max Fisher, UJA National Women's chairman Mrs. Jack Karp, and UJA Executive Vice-Chairman Rabbi Herbert A. Friedman would address the conference. The

news that these additional personalities will participate in the program promises to make this annual Conference one of the outstanding Jewish functions ever held on the West Coast.

Another feature of the Conference will be a separate breakfast for the young West Coast leadership with Ambassador Harman, it was announced by Irwin S. Field, West Coast Regional Vice-Chairman of the Young Leadership Cabinet.

The UJA Conference traditionally signals the kick-off for the 1966 campaigns on the West Coast. Many communities have already scheduled their initial fundraising functions immediately following the Conference and hope that the climate set at Coronado will contribute toward their successful campaigns in 1966.
