BONN (WNS) The West German government announced that it has extended a "first credit" of 75,000,000 Deutschmarks (\$18,750,000) to Israel. The credit will be paid out of the current 1965 budget.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Premier Levi Eshkol who was confined to his home after coming down with influenza, still hopes to present a new coalition government to Parliament within a few days. It is still uncertain, however, if he would present a narrow coalition or a broad based one.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israeli officials said here that they would be watching with "caution and apprehension" the activities of the Indian, Maj. General Indar Jit Rikhye, who appointed new commander of the United Nations peacekeeping force in Gaza this week.

SAN FRANCISCO (WNS) American President Lines confirmed that the scheduled round-the-world cruise of the passenger ship President Roosevelt will not include a previously planned stop in Haifa. A spokesman for the shipping company said that Egypt had informed the APL that passage through the Suez Canal would be denied if the ship called at Haifa.

NEW YORK, Henry N. Rapaport of Scarsdale, N.Y., was installed as president of the United Synagogue of America, Sunday, January 9. Chancellor Louis Finkelstein of The Jewish Theological Seminary of America conducted the installation ceremonies.

PHILADELPHIA: The Philadelphia Chapter of the American Jewish Committee has urged civic and community organizations to refrain from holding meetings at social clubs that exclude persons from membership on racial or religious grounds.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Dr. Herman Kahn, head of the Hudson Institute for Strategic Research and a noted authority on nuclear warfare, advised Israel to engage in nuclear research but not to manufacture nuclear weapons.

JERUSALEM (WNS) The Government of Israel's plan to name a Minister for the Diaspora whose job will be to establish closer contact between Israel and Jewish communities abroad.

WASHINGTON (WNS) American and Israeli desalination experts began final talks on the feasibility study which envisages the operation in Israel by 1972 of a duel purpose nuclear powered water desalting plant. WASHINGTON (WNS) The Johnson administration is considering favorable action on Israel's request to buy \$70, 000,000 of wheat and other foods over the next two years.

In another development informed sources revealed that Israel has asked the United States for a loan of \$39,000,000 to finance development projects.

LONDON (WNS) Following the signing of a food surplus agreement with the United States, Egypt began to discuss World Bank financing of development projects, according to reports received here from Cairo.

Whenever I see a litvak the litvaks and other Jews I feel good inside,

There was a time when litvaks were at odds with other Jewish groups, such as Poles, or Rumanians, or that large group known by the generic name of galitzyaner. And there was a time when all those Eastern European Jews were on bad terms with the German Jews, known derisively as yahudim.

So bitter was the hostility that separate clubs would be formed to keep the others out. So bitter was the hostility that marriages among them were regarded as intermarriages.

Now the bad blood has disappeared. What was once a cause for hatred is now no more than a cuase for humor. I love the one about the galitzianer who discovered that his friend was a litvak and began to poke fun at him only to evoke the retort: "There are two kinds of Jews: litvaks and paskudnyakes. Which are you?" (For translations of these exotic terms see your nearest rabbi or grandparent.)

Nowadays Jews are all mixed up -- I mean, with respect to their backgrounds. The descendants of German Jews are married to offspring of Lithuanians, Hungarians, Russians, etc. We're one happy salad.

So when I see a litvak I feel good. For, I tell myself, if the vendetta twixt
