The Madhouse, on the Strip between Milton Prell's soonto-open-full-blast new Alladin and the Desert Inn Ho-

tels, popularly known as The Sands, is a combination these days of New Year's Eve on Times Square, Mardi Gras in Basin Street and VJ-Day along Constitution Ave., solely because an entertainer named Frank Sinatra appears there twice nightly.

The long, long lines stretching the full length of the casino, a city block with anxious faces hoping to get in at every performance is ample proof of the man's drawing power, said to be the greatest in the history of night club show business. The acclamations in all mediums of communication have exhausted every known word and phrase of praise, and some that have been concocted for the occasion. What is there to say about the man that hasn't been said many times before by the best word masters in the literary world?

Although there are 20 men on stage, mainly Count Basie's orchestra, there could have been a million, or none. All eyes are constantly glued on Sinatra, You can't help but agree with everything you heard and read about the man as a performer, but you keep probing into your mind to find out why.
