

Shoofey Named to Hosp. Post

Alex J. Shoofey has been named Associate Chairman of the Las Vegas Friends of National Jewish Hospital at Denver by Chairman Edward Levinson who heads the Fremont Hotel.

Shoofey, executive vice president of the Sahara-Nevada Corporation, also is General Manager of the Hotel Sahara.

Long active for the National Jewish Hospital, he previously had served as a member of the Executive Committee of the Las Vegas group.

He recently was one of several westerners who received NJH's special meritorious Award for Distinguished Philanthropic Service.

He joins Jack Entratter, Carl Cohen and Robert Rice as associate chairmen of the Las Vegas Committee.

Founded in 1899, NJH provides free medical care to persons in need, regardless of race, religion or origin, if afflicted with tuberculosis or allied chest ailments.

In recent years it also has attained world fame for the ad-

vance techniques developed in its laboratories in the fight against chest diseases.

Local offices are maintained in Los Angeles at 7250 Beverly Blvd., under the direction of Saul Bekoff.

Judge R. Foley Honored

Retired Federal Judge Roger T. Foley, the City of Hope "Man of the Year," will be honored during a dinner Jan. 23 in the Gold Room of the Convention Center.

Governor Grant Sawyer will be the principal speaker. District Judge John Mowbray will present the award.

Judge Foley, who has seen the decline of one Nevada city — Goldfield, and the escalation of another — Las Vegas, retired from the bench in 1957 although he has sat in on cases as late as 1963.

The 79-year-old jurist tried his first case in Las Vegas courts in 1928. At that time, as a young lawyer, he travelled to Las Vegas from Los Angeles to defend a young man on an embezzlement charge.

After successfully defending the client in a jury trial before the late Justice William E. Orr, Foley decided to move to Las Vegas.

During the ceremonies honoring the 79-year-old judge,

William Southard will act as master of ceremonies. Mark Gallon, executive secretary of the board of trustees of the City of Hope, will be on hand representing the sponsoring organization.

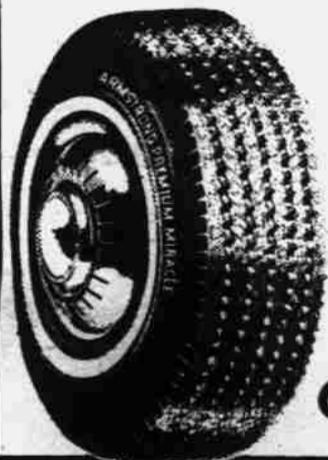
