ILLEGAL ENTRY

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israeli troops guarding the Mount Scopus enclave fired warning shots to drive away Jordanians who had entered the area illegally to farm it. No one was hurt.

The Mount Scopus enclave where the buildings of the original Hebrew University and the Hadassah Medical school are located, is within Jordanian territory, but is under Israeli sovereignty. Jordanian farmers have been permitted occasionally to cultivate land in the enclave, but Israeli officials said that this time they had entered without permission.

NEW YORK (WNS) A statement deploring what it called "intervention" by the Synagogue Council of America in the current controversy over American policy in Vietnam was issued by Agudath Israel of America. Declaring that the Synagogue Council statement of views "creates a false image of the position taken by the Jewish citizens of our country in this delicate and complex area," Agudath Israel said a "consensus of American Jewry would probably support President Johnson's policies in Vietnam, and the statement issued earlier by the Synagogue Council of America advising the President on what future course America should take in this complex situation can only harm the interests of peace and the interests of the Jewish people."

Judge Zenoff Files

District Judge David Zenoff, who has been serving on the Supreme Court since last spring, has filed for his first six-year term as Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court.

The date of filing was Monday, Jan. 24, the same date he filed four years ago for the District Court, the birthday of his daughter Terrie, a college senior.

Governor Grant Sawyer, at the request of Justices Gordon Thompson and Milton Badt, had appointed Zenoff to the high court bench to replace the ailing Justice

Frank McNamee, because of Dave's outstanding judicial work in Las Vegas during the past six and one-half years. As a District Judge, his decisions appealed to the Supreme Court have been affirmed 80 percent of the cases, a remarkable achievement.

But Zenoff is much more than a man in a robe, sitting behind a high bench dispensing justice.

As reported in an earlier edition of the Israelite, Judge Dave is a man of many roles and many purposes in life--all of them an asset to humanity and a credit to our community. In addition to being one of the most able of jurists, he has chalked up a tremendous background of service in the interests of children and the prevention and cure of juvenile delinquency. He is a founder and past president of Spring Mountain Youth Camp, in addition to being a member of

ANTI-SEMITISM

MUNICH (WNS) The wave of anti-Semitic incidents which has recently swept over the city of Bamberg has seemingly poured over into other parts of Germany.

This was the explanation given by local police on discovery of nocturnal anti-Semitic scribbles on the city's sidewalks and advertising posters. Some of the city walls were painted with slogans such as "Jews, get out." Munich's history has been one of staunch nazism.

The other city where the anti-Semitic goons operated was Heilbronn, where swastikas were found painted on store windows and walls.
