

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

**NEW YORK:** Arthur J. Goldberg, U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, received the America's Democratic Legacy Award, presented annually by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith for "distinguished contributions to the enrichment of our democratic heritage."

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** The sixtieth anniversary of the founding of the Farband-Labor Zionist Order in the United States and of Poale Zion, Zionist labor organization, was observed at a ceremony attended by more than 500 members of the Farband Syrkin Club who settled in Israel.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** Former Premier David Ben Gurion, renewing his current fight with Premier Levi Eshkol and his new government, charged that the new regime was using the army "for party interests."

**LONDON (WNS)** Public controversy over the validity of marriages performed by Reform rabbis has triggered a move by the Board of Deputies of British Jews in the hopeful direction of restoring and maintaining "harmony in the community."

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** Planned establishment of a movement whose aim would be "depoliticization" of religious life in Israel was announced by Prof. Efraim Urbach, a noted Talmudic scholar on the faculty of the Hebrew University.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** The spectre of a general strike by members of their academic staffs is facing all institutions of higher learning in Israel.

**MADRID (WNS)** A new Spanish stamp bearing the imprint of the famed Toledo Synagogue has been issued by the Spanish government.

**AMSTERDAM (WNS)** Two bridges on the site of the former ghetto in this city have been named after two rabbis by the Municipal Council of Amsterdam.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** The Jewish Reform movement in America will conduct a vigorous campaign throughout the country, alone and with association of other religious faiths, to the end of keeping alive the "dialogue for peace" in Vietnam.

**PHILADELPHIA (WNS)** Disclosure that W. Henry Mac Farland, new chairman of the Conservative Party of Pennsylvania, had a record of anti-Jewish and anti-Negro activities over a period of twenty years was made by David Berger, former City Solicitor and chairman of the ADL Metropolitan Philadelphia Advisory Board.

**LAKEWOOD, N.J. (WNS)** A leading Jewish scholar counselled Orthodox Jews to shun "every public debate, dialogue or symposium concerning the dogmatic or ritual aspects of our faith vis-a-vis similar aspects of another faith community."

**CHICAGO (WNS)** An appeal to Jewish parents of this city to encourage enrollment of their children in Hebrew classes in the city's high schools, coupled with a commitment that he would do all in his "power to help boost the Hebrew language and secure teachers and the necessary materials," was sounded here this week by Dr. Thaddeus J. Lubera, associate superintendent in charge of instruction for the Chicago Board of Education.
