JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

FRANKFURT (WNS) The Municipal Council of this city has decided to name a new high school after Martin Buber, the German born Jewish philosopher who died in Israel last year.

BONN(WNS) The Volkswagen Foundation has announced a gift of \$75,000 to the Leo Baeck Institute in New York for expansion of its archives and library. The Institute is a central agency for the collection and study of documents on Jewish life in Germany and was established ten years ago by Jews from Germany.

TEL AVIV (WNS) A settlement in the eastern Huleh Valley was attacked by gunfire from Syrian positions. The shooting lasted two hours, but there were no casualties and the fire was not returned.

NEW YORK (WNS) Two Catholic writers who recently visited Moscow as members of an interfaith delegation reported this week that when Chief Rabbi Yehuda Leib Levin of Moscow receives foreign vistors he is always surrounded by men who appear to be government agents. The two were the Rev. Thurston N. Davis, editor-in-chief of the Jesuit weekly America, and Father Eugene K. Culhane, America's managing editor. Both said "there is little to contradict the charge of Soviet anti-Semitism."

WALTHAM(WNS) Rabbi Joachim Prinz, president of the American JEWISH Congress, and Dr. Karl Heinrich Knappstein, West German Ambassador to the United States, engaged in a dialogue at Brandeis University on a wide spectrum of German-Jewish problems, including Bonn's relations with Israel.

LONDON(WNS) Belief that six men he had found guilty of "maliciously setting fire" to two East London synagogues last July had been led to the criminal act by "the indoctrination" they received from the "pernicious" neo-Nazi movement in England, was voiced here by Justice Phillimore as he imposed on the defendants prison terms ranging from six months to five years.

BONN (WNS) Disclosure that victims of nazism, mostly Jews, had been shortchanged by about \$100,000,000 in the past ten years has triggered a demand for a correction of the alleged "error" and repayment of the difference to the victims.

NEW YORK (WNS) A refusal by the New York Board of Education to grant meeting permits to the National Renaissance Party in the city's public schools has been ruled illegal by the City Corporation Counsel and the neo-nazi group will be permitted to hold a meeting after school hours, it was announced here by board president Lloyd K, Garrison.

ZURICH (WNS) Disclosure that the Swiss city of Lausanne was the site of the headquarters of the neo-Nazi movement in Europe was made by the Swiss Federation of Jewish Communities.

NEW YORK (WNS) Jacques Lipschitz, world famed Jewish sculptor, has been named by the National Institute of Arts and Letters as the winner of its gold medal for sculpture in 1966.

WASHINGTON (WNS) Admission that he had subsidized a campaign to "expose the kosher food racket" was made by Imperial Wizard James R. Vebable in testimony before the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

At the same time a former Wilmington, Delaware, policeman testified that he had quit the Klan when he discovered it was linked to the American Nazi Party.

NEW YORK (WNS) Transmittal of \$50,000 to Israel in honor of Mrs. Zena Harman, wife of Israel's Ambassador to the United States, was announced at the three-day meeting of the board of directors of Pioneer Women, Women's Labor Zionist Organization.



(Continued from Page 1) Freedom Ring, an extremist propagands operation using telephone automatic announcement service, was again cited as the principal offender.

Following a League complaint filed with the FCC of September 3, the American Telephone and Telegraph Company announced that names and addresses of subscribers to the announcement service would be given out on request in order to "facilitate recourse to the courts by those who considered themselves defamed."

The League said the telephone company is in the same position as a telegraph company when it has been made aware of the libelous content of a message it transmits. It it thereafter permits the repeated transmission of the message, it should be held responsible, according to the League.

WALTHAM (WNS) Stephen B. Mugar , a Massachsetts philanthropist whose family fled Armenia in 1906, has given a gift of \$500,000 to Brandeis University toward establishment of a university research center that is to bear the name of Benjamin Brown, a Boston attorney who is a close friend of the donor.

JERUSALEM (WNS) President Johnson in his talks in Washington with Foreign Minister Abba Eban assured him that Israel need have no fear for its existence as long as he was the President of the United States, it was reported here by the Foreign Ministry.

MIAMI BEACH (WNS) Max Bressler of Chicago, president of the Jewish National Fund of America and former president of the Zionist Organization of America, died of a heart attack at the age of 64.
