

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

VIENNA (WNS) Evidence is being amassed in preparation for the trial of former Nazis, among them forty physicians involved in the extermination of thousands of Jews and others in the infamous Auschwitz death camp.

LONDON (WNS) A Moscow court has sentenced five Russians to death for participating in the wartime murder of 14,000 Russians, mostly Jews.

MIAMI BEACH (WNS) The Israel Bond Organization adopted a record quota of \$105,000,000 for the year 1966 following reports that cessation of West German reparations would put a burden on Israel's development program. The 2,000 Jewish leaders attending the parley paid tribute to Mrs. Golda Meir, former Israeli Foreign Minister, who was guest of honor at a dinner marking the conclusion of the conference. Mrs. Meir was cited as a "heroic symbol of Jewish courage and rebirth."

NEW YORK (WNS) The question whether there is room on a police force for admitted Birchers came to focus here in full sharpness when Police Commissioner Howard R. Leary declared on assuming his new post that he had no objection to members of his force belonging to the John Birch Society providing such membership did not impair their efficiency.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Opposition to Premier Levi Eshkol's proposed national budget erupted on the floor of Knesset, with both opposition members and members of his own coalition joining in its criticism. Chief opposition critic was Gen. Moshe Dayan of the Israel Workers Party, who charged that the government's \$1,500,000,000 budget was the antithesis of "what the Government claims its policy to be."

TEL AVIV (WNS) Israel currently is engaged in "an unprecedented process of strengthening itself and buying arms," it was declared here by Co. Moshe Kashti, director general of the Israel Defense Ministry.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Syrian gunners southeast of Lake Tiberias fired anew on Israeli farmers, aiming mainly at an Israeli tractor that had just completed a ploughing chore.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Approval of the government decision to hold this year's Independence Day parade in Haifa was given by the Parliamentary Foreign and Security Affairs Committee.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Dr. George Wise, who resigned as president of the Tel Aviv University, declared here on departure for two weeks visit to the U.S. that the development was triggered by a policy dispute with university rector Dr. Benzion Katz.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Field crops in Israel have suffered damages to the extent of \$15,000,000 as a result of the severe drought.

TEL AVIV (WNS) The American Joint Distribution Committee this year will assist more than 400,000 needy Jews throughout the world, including 97,000 in Israel.

WASHINGTON (WNS) Premier Gulya Kallai of Hungary has urged the Arab countries to enter into peace negotiations with Israel.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) The Dutch Government is currently weighing a request by the West German Government for the extradition of Baron Andres von Koskull, wartime officer in the Nazi army, accused of having been involved in the murder of Jews in southern Russia.

NEW ROCHELLE, N.Y. (WNS) Furhter elimination from the liturgy of passages that are offensive to Jews was counselled on the Catholic Church by the Rev. Walter M. Abbott, associate editor of the Jesuit weekly America.

NEW YORK (WNS) Conflicting views on American policy in Vietnam were voiced here this week by the Rabbinical Alliance of America and by lay and rabbinic leaders addressing a conference at Columbia University under the sponsorship of the Synagogue Council of America, national coordinating agency for the rabbinic and congregational organizations of the three branches of Judaism, Orthodox, Conservative and Reform.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Marlene Dietrich, the famed German-born actress who has been an American citizen for thirty years, was received by President and Mrs. Zalman Shazar.

NEW YORK...Jerome Sorcher, Chief Accountant of the American Jewish Committee since 1961, died after a long illness. He was 43.
