The Las Vegas Chapter of Hadassah will sponsor a puppet show and party for children Sunday, at 1:00 p.m. at the Danny Kolod Youth House, Temple Beth Sholom, 1600 East Oakey Blvd. in celebration of the 18th World Jewish Child's Day.

Originally called Child's Day for Youth Aliyah, the international holiday is observed by millions to promote friendship between the children of Israel and children throughout the free world. It began as the International Children's Rescue and Immigration Movement, bringing children from Hitler's Germany and other places in Europe to Israel.

Today, Youth Aliyah sponsors children's movements from North Africa, the Middle East, and eastern European lands for rehabilitation in special children's vil-

lages, settlements, and institutions in Israel.

World Jewish Child's Day is the main fund raising event for Youth Aliyah. Children are given coin books to (Continued on Page 2)

Slew 70,000

BONN (WNS) Witnesses at the trial in East Berlin of Dr. Horst Fischer have testified that the Nazi Medic had been involved in the extermination of 70,000 inmates in the infamous Auschwitz death camp, where he was a "selection doctor" for the gas chambers.

Dr. Fischer was arrested in June of 1965 after having lived for twenty years in East Germany under his own name. All he did to conceal his identity was to remove a tattoo on his arm which he wore as an SS official.

The accused Nazi has admitted guilt.
