WASHINGTON (WNS) Bold admission that the Palestine Liberation Organization is receiving arms from Communist China and that consultations were afoot with Hanoi to train some of its army units "in guerilla warfare in Viet Nam" was made by Ahmed Shukairy, head of the Palestine Liberation Organization.

Speaking over radio Cairo in a rebroadcast of a speech he delivered at a Palestine Liberation Army camp in Israel, Mr. Shukairy said Vice President Humphrey was right when he told the American Jewish Press Association at its recent convention in Washington that the Palestine Liberation Organization was a threat to Israel and to peace.

Boasting that he and his movement "are a threat to Israel," Shukairy admitted getting arms from Red China having officers "trained in

the arms of liberation and the experience of the Chinese" and of being in consultation with Hanoi on training his army in guerilla warfare in Vietnam.

WASHINGTON (WNS) An amendment barring further American assistance to Arab refugees participating in the Palestine Liberation Organization under the leadership of Ahmed Shukairy was voted by the House Foreign Affairs Committee.

ARABS' CHEMICAL WARFARE

WASHINGTON (WNS) Officers in the unified Arab command are being drilled in planned chemical warfare against Israel at Ar-Rashid camp near Baghdad, Iraq, according to reports reaching here.

Disclosing that the drilling was "in implementation of the resolutions of the conference of Arab directors of military training sponsored by the Arab armies' unified command in Cairo last mon-

JERUSALEM (WNS) The call by King Hussein of Jordan for the dissolution of the Arab refugee camps and the integration of the refugees in the countries of their

present domicile is being viewed here in informed political circles as an event of major importance and as an opening to a potential settlement of the Arab-Israel conflict.

Adding significance to the King's statement, made over Radio Amman, is the fact that it simultaneously disclosed a break with the Palestine Liberation Organization, whose readers have openly admitted receiving arms from Red China and planning to train some units in guerilla warfare in Vietnam. King Hussein warned that this was an "extremist group" and that Jordan would take firm action against its supporters.

One political source here viewed the development as "a realistic approach that could contribute to the stability of the Middle East." Another was of the opinion that if the King's position is implemented, it could open the door to peace and stability in this area of the world.

At the same time it is being recalled here that Israel has been a staunch advocate of integration as a solution to the Arab refugee problem and that it has repeatedly offered to make a financial contribution toward such a settlement.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Shells fired by Syrian anti-aircraft guns at two Israeli jet planes fell on an Israeli grazing field causing damage to five hundred acres of land that caught fire, it was announced here by government officials who noted that the assault occurred within twenty four hours after inspection of the line of demarcation between the two countries by a team of U.N. observers.
