Campaign Ethics

Democratic congressional candidate Ralph Denton yesterday called for the creation of a Fair Campaign Practices Committee "to investigate and report incidences of character assassination and appeals to prejudice" in political campaigns.

The request was made by letter to State Chairman William McDonald, of Winnemucca.

Pledging to conduct his own campaign "on the issues rather than personalities," Denton said the use of unfair and sometimes illegal tactics in political campaigns has resulted in many highly qualified men refusing to run for public office because "politics" has become a dirty word.

"I believe that a person who offers himself as a candidate should have some assurance that he will not be subjected to harassment, and that campaigns will be conducted on a high level," Denton said.

Denton told McDonald, "I was subjected to an unsavory incident two years ago when an unsigned pamphlet was circulated in the closing days of the congressional campaign."

He charged that the pamphlet was a strong appeal to racial prejudice and hatred, and "had no place in politics."

ed as master calendar judge for the past eighteen months, previously practiced private law in Las Vegas. He was a deputy district attorney here from 1949 to 1952.

Constable Woody Cole is off and running for re-election again—this time for his tenth term as constable of Las Vegas township.

With the exception of the years 1949-51 and 1955-56, Cole, a Democrat, has held office continually.

A native of New Mexico, the 6-6 one time rodeo rider and movie actor has been a member of both the Las Vegas Police Department and the Clark County Sheriff's Office. He has been a Las Vegas resident since 1942.

He is known as one of the prime movers of the Nevada Constable's Association and was their first charter president in addition to being elected president twice.

Well known in Nevada, Cole is an active member of the Footprinters Association, the Elks Lodge, Las Vegas Press Club and an officer in the Southern Nevada Athletic Union.

During his term of presidency of the Footprinters Association, the organization received national attention for its sponsorship of the Western States Golden Gloves tourney here and the national AAU Senior Boxing championships.

Benneman Tells Candidacy

Joseph Benneman Sr., has announced his candidacy for Assembly District 4, Las Vegas and the outlying townships.

Benneman, who failed in his bid for the Assembly in 1964, said he would "help to protect our prime industry . . . and encourage the establishment of new industries in our state." Benneman also hopes to establish a veteran's hospital in Clark County.
