

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS) The American Civil Liberties Union called on the Postmaster General of the United States to abandon the idea of putting out this year a special Christmas stamp bearing the reproduction of the Madonna and Child by the noted artist Hans Memling.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Sharp criticism of Jewish federations for failing to give wider support to Jewish education was sounded here by a prominent educator at the 40th anniversary convention of the National Council for Jewish Education in the United States.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Some 130 yeshivas in Israel this year will have received 15 percent of their budgets from the Joint Distribution Committee, it was disclosed here by Rabbi Leo Jung of New York in a statement in which he said that the JDC was giving the yeshivas grants totaling \$1,000,000.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Alleged failure by Kol Israel, Radio Israel, to give full and extensive coverage to the message sent by President Habib Bourguiba of Tunisia to President Truman on the occasion of the ground-breaking ceremony for the Truman Center for the Advancement of Peace at the Hebrew University here has triggered an investigation by Israel's Broadcasting Authority.

PHILADELPHIA... Many leading civic organizations in Philadelphia are opposed to holding meetings at discriminatory clubs, Robert K. Greenfield, president of the Philadelphia Chapter of the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, reported, basing his statement on recent correspondence with a number of such groups.

NEW YORK -- A grant of \$260,000 from the Herman Muehlstein Foundation, Inc., New York, to provide 40 two-year scholarships over the next five years for the graduate professional social work education of Jewish Community Center and YM-YWHA workers was announced here by Sanford Solender, executive vice-president of the National Jewish Welfare Board.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Recent and recurrent Syrian incursions into Israel have "forced us to prove once again that those who plan to strike at our peace, property and lives will not be given a free hand to do so," Premier Levi Eshkol declared here in a talk at military graduation exercises.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Launching of a government study to determine the personal status of the Karaites in Israel was announced here at the first meeting of the public committee that has been set up to study the problem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Sharp criticism was leveled here at the American Jewish community for "coming hat in hand to Israel to beg for teachers" for Jewish schools in the United States.

NEW YORK (WNS) The most urgent human rights problem that the World Jewish Congress has to deal with is the situation of Soviet Jewry, it was declared here by Dr. Maurice L. Perlzweig on the eve of the fifth plenary assembly of the WJC.

WASHINGTON (WNS) New efforts by the United States to have the Arab countries accept greater responsibility for the Palestine refugees living in their midst were disclosed here at a hearing of the Senate Subcommittee on Refugees in testimony by two high State Department officials.

NEW YORK -- Major developments in Jewish-Christian relations in the United States over the past five years will be surveyed by Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, Director of Interreligious Affairs for the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, in a major presentation at the forthcoming International Conference of Jewish-Christian Relations, to be held August 7-15, 1966 at Newnham College, Cambridge, England.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A warning that the Mapam party may not be able to continue in the Eshkol coalition government if a three-year austerity program advocated by Minister of Finance Pinhas Sapir is adopted without major changes was sounded here by Mapam leaders, who simultaneously disclosed that the Premier had assured them there would be no government action on the Sapir program before the matter is informally discussed with the coalition members.

BONN (WNS) Settlement of the Arab-Israel conflict on the basis of the United Nations "decision on the partition of Palestine, coupled with the return of the Arab refugees," was urged here by President Habib Bourguiba of Tunisia on his arrival for an official visit to this country.

TEL AVIV (WNS) To demonstrate their determination to get a sizeable wage increase, four hundred nurses went on a twenty-four hour strike that largely paralyzed Israel's hospitals.

SAIGON, Vietnam -- In addition to the campaign in which they are engaged on the war fronts, the Jewish servicemen of I Field Force Vietnam participated in the 1966 campaign of the United Jewish Appeal by contributing \$147.

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- The Student Zionist Organization has announced that because of the success of its "Domestic Jewish Education Corps," in Fargo, North Dakota, it again will go to another or perhaps two small towns next summer to enrich the Jewish education and Israel culture of small Jewish communities.

NEW YORK (LNS) For the eighteenth consecutive year students of the Labvitcher Yeshiva in New York will visit hundreds of Jewish communities, to meet with the Rabbis and Jewish communal leaders, visit the synagogues and Jewish educational institutions, and meet thousands of Jews comprising the grass roots Jewish populace in homes and on the street.

NEW YORK -- Twelve new Jewish military chaplains have entered the U.S. Armed Forces in time to officiate at Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) services for Jewish military personnel, it was announced by Rabbi Selwyn D. Ruslander, chairman of the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB) Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy. Rosh Hashanah begins at sundown, September 14, and continues through sundown, September 16.
