TORAH WRAPPER COMMORATING BIRTH OF HAIM GOMPERS.

NEW YORK--For the first time in this country, fine art relating to traditional Jewish life will be reproduced on museum quality greeting cards and notepaper.

The subjects are drawn from such diverse sources as a 14th century Rhenish manuscript and a 19th century Persian marriage contract. Some cards are in full color, others are black-and-white woodcuts, and fine engravings. They are all suitable for framing.

Commentary, a monthly journal of thought and opinion on contemporary issues and Jewish affairs, is publishing the cards as part of its program of promoting all aspects of Jewish cultural life. It is making them available at as little as ten cents each.

The original works reproduced by the cards are in the collections of the New York Public Library and the Jewish Museum, and it is through the courtesy of these institutions that they have been made available for the Commentary program.

The cards are packaged in groups of twenty--twenty identical cards in each package. A boxed assortment of all the cards--each of fifteen subjects--is also available.

The subjects include: 18th century French engravings--"Searching for Leavened Bread before Passover" and

"Blowing the Shofar on Rosh Hashanah"; 17th-century Dutch woodcut representations of Sukkot, Simhat Torah and Purim; a 14th century manuscript illumination; details from embroidered Torah wrappers; and 18th-century German engravings of the observation of Yom Kippur and Shavout.

National retail distribution will be set up by early August, and synagogue book and gift shops will also carry them. For information contact Lenore Kohn, Commentary, 165 E. 56 St., New York City, N.Y.
