GOV. EDMUND BROWN, (CAL.) D., seeking reelection: "I frankly am disturbed by the way a dangerous few would divide and disrupt our economy and state by exploiting hate and promoting doubt and conflict among us . . . I refuse the support of the John Birch Society, Communists, or any other organization of either the left or the right and the Democratic party will not accept such support."

LT. GOV. PAUL LAXALT. R., seeking governorship: "The Birch Society breeds fear and distrust and follows a pattern of irresponsibility and destructive action . . . I have read the society attempts to turn white against Negro and Gentile against Jew and now it's evenbrother against brother. I support a resolution repudiating the John Birch Society."

ED FIKE, R., seeking lieutenant governorship: "I reject the Birchers, I don't want it phrased in flowery language. We must repudiate them wholly . . . The Jewish community in Las Vegas was particularly concerned about the tactics and aims of the Birchers."

RALPH DENTON, D., seeking U.S. Representative seat: "I reject all extremism movements in this country, either to the left or to the right. Extremism in my opinion leads to tyranny, I do not and will not solicit the

support of any extreme group, and this includes both the Communists and the John Birch Society."

FLOYD LAMB, D., for state senator: "If I need the vote of extremists and radicals like Communists or Birchers to be elected, Pd rather not be elected."

GOV. GRANT SAWYER, D., seeking re-election: "I have never sought the support of the John Birch Society, and I do not want it now. There is no room in the United States for extremist groups who have placed themselves outside the standards of political morality, who seek to spread their venom through the lifestream of this nation.

"My position on extremism is the same today as it was when I first took office. I want no part of the misguided people who follow its nefarious goals or the programs they pursue in the name of 'patriotism.'

"Patriotism is not hatred, it is not bigotry, it is not slander. It is not a vicious assault on anyone who dares to be different, who speaks for a minority view. It is not evil deeds performed in the name of passion for liberty.

"It has been my pleasure to join with Jack Tell, one of the first Nevada newsmen to fight the threat of extremism, and other responsible citizens in meeting this problem in Nevada."
