FOR SALE HISTORICAL NAZI-FLAG (1923) FOR SALE. THIS FLAG EXISTS ONCE IN THE WORLD! COLLECTORwrite with quotation of price to: XXLL2244 Times.

Was this just a "blind" for dissemenating Nazi propaganda? Or, was this an authentic business offer? Was the advertiser an American? Or, was he a foreigner? Was

In July, for one whole he a fanatic? Or was he "for

The only thing certain was the unusual phraseology of the second sentence, "This flag exists once in the world!" It was sufficient to pique the curiosity of a World War II veteran named Brendel Walters (of New York City) who answered it.

Walters, a journalist, replied in his letter that he was interested in a certain Nazi flag and was prepared to pay as high as \$400 for it, if it met the specifications. Naturally, Walters (which is not his real name) did not give

They'll Never Forget

The story of the Nazi annihilation of six million Jews has been told many times. There have been newspaper accounts, films, speeches, documented reports and literary works, notably Elie Weisel's haunting novels. Some have been objectively factual; some gruesomely stark; still others imaginative fantasy. But none has been more effective than the hour-long documentary "Memorandum", produced by the National Film Board of Canada in the restrained understatement that is so typically British.

"Memorandum" is a carefully detailed and painfully moving account of the Nazi death camps that utilized Germany Army clips as the background for a visit of survivors to Bergen Belsen last summer on the 20th anniversary of its liberation by the British Army. They had come to say kaddish for the men, women and children they had left behind. As Josef Rosensaft, New York businessman who heads the Bergen Belsen Federation, said: We shall not forget and we shall not forgive."

The Federation is cooperating with the Canadian National Film Board for the distribution of the film in this country to both Jewish and other groups. When you have the opportunity of seeing it, don't miss this picture which points up German guilt for the murder of the Jews as it plaintively asks:

"And if it could happen in the fairy land of Hansel & Gretel, and the Pied Piper of Hamelin, could it not happen anywhere? And could it not happen anywhere, if it could happen in the cultured land of Bach, Beethoven and Schiller?"

Would that the millions of Germans who are now electing neo-Nazis in Hesse and Bavaria, and thinking of an ex-Nazi, Kurt Kiesinger, as their next Chancellor, be enabled to see this film. In the name of the Free World, of which they purport to be a part, they too should "not forget".

FURGIVE GERMANS:

It isn't a pleasant sight to see grown men cry, but adults of the Jewish Faith all over the world are shedding many tears over circumstances that have come to light in the past several months.

The setback, to be sure is temporary, in the form of unrelated incidents which serve only to deter and hinder the tremendous strides being accomplished in the last decade to minimize and erase anti-Semitism and religious bias. It proves there is a pendulum at the highest level, perhaps God's , which seeks to slow up any movement, even the most righteous, from traveling too fast in any
