his real address but listed a business room number in a well-populated New York City office building where a friend of his is employed. When dealing with anything, or one identified even remotely as NAZI, the highest precaution is not out of order, Walters states.

In November 1923 the first Nazi Puch in Munich was attempted, Walters recalled, and thought perhaps the Flag for sale might have been part of this 'historical' event,

received, via air-mail, some three weeks later. It was postmarked WEST GER-MANY: a town Neubiberg, in a section known as Lechstr. with a Munich phone number. It was typewritten in very

It was typewritten in very poor but intelligible English. It did not prove or disprove that the advertiser

was a Nazi. It did not prove or disprove that the man was a fanatic. It did prove, however, he was a businessman interested in a good profit. His price came high. \$2,000.


Here are the exact excerpts of his letter:

In 1952 during pull down of a house in the world known town Bad Kissingen in Germany the flag was found immured in a wall, put in a iron-box*** I suppose this flag is originated with embroidery by hand in the early

beginning of the year 1923. Later on, toward the end of 1923 that Nazi party were prohibited in Germany. Flags had to be sequestrated by police and destroyed by burn. In the reign of Hitler this flag was made a symbol. The writer went on to state that in the trade such original flags, belonging to the first days of the Nazi party, are seldom obtainable. This, his minimum offer of \$2,000.

"It claimed the highest stake humanity could pay: In the millions...Its worth nothing in the market today we fervently hope."

Brendel Walters states that he does not intend to bid for the flag. But, he intimated, further correspondence with the "seller." PAGE SEVEN
