quarter of our Temple's fiscal year. The response by the membership to the statement billing for the first quarter has been most encouraging. A good portion of our members have already paid their dues in full. I would, therefore, like to address these few remarks to those of our members who pay quarterly or monthly. It is perfectly agreeable to have members pay on their accounts every month or every quarter; but I want you to understand that it is vitally important that your payments are made regularly and on time. Our budget for this comign year -- the Temple's fiscal year is from September 1, 1966 to August 31, 1967 -- is completed at this time and received final approval by our Board of Directors.

The entire success of the formula of financing our Temple properly, lies in the need for payments on time and accounts up-to-date. The same holds true for accounts charged with Religious School and Sunday School tuition as well as any pledges made. We count on, and must have, income on a regular basis. Those of you who can pay up your accounts in full, help smooth our way financially that much sooner.

The financing operation of any Temple depends completely on the cooperation and understanding of its members. Each member assumes his share of the responsibilities involved. We are making every effort not to bother you with any additional appeals for funds, and we can accomplish this only if all our members do what is expected of them. You will undoubtedly recall that we did not burden you with prolonged Yiskor Appeal on Yom Kippur Day, nor was there any appeal for funds on Kol Nidre evening; yet it is a fact that the Temple counts on the generosity and thoughtfulness of all its members.

Zenoff Serves Freedoms Foundation

An International Declaration on Soviet Jewry was simultaneously issued throughout the world Wednesday, on the first day of Hanukkah, by central Jewish organizations in eighteen countries, including such countries as the United States, France, Italy, Japan, Holland, Mexico and Ireland. The statement was issued in this country by Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the American Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry, which is comprised of 25 national Jewish religious and secular groups.

Declaring that the Jewish communities of these eighteen countries will "continue our protests and appeals until the Jewish minority is assured equality of treatment with all other ethnic and national groups in the U.S.S.R.," the Declaration presented a six-point program to the Soviet government urging the abolishment of current violations of human rights suffered by the three million Jews in Soviet Russia.

The International Declaration follows the publication Sunday of a similar statement signed by ninety U.S. Senators and precedes a nationwide series of protests in thirty-two communities throughout the

It Does Not Add Up

No one "quelled" more than this writer when Arthur Goldberg magnanimously resigned from a lifetime position as justice with the United States Supreme Court to assume the post of U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, succeeding the late Adlai Stevenson.

Although Goldberg had established himself as an outstanding Jew and on many occasions declared himself an ardent Zionist, there never was any doubt in this writer's mind exactly where Goldberg's loyalty rested in his capacity as our nation's representative to the world body. But there are some who do dispute that Goldberg is a good American and a good Jew.

It all does not add up.

Just in case there may be some among our readers who are not fully acquainted with the circumstances, let us review the events that call for an evaluation of Goldberg's
