From Herb Brin's Heritage Arabs Slay Child of Hitler Terror

TEL AVIV (Special)-As I write this column, the news broadcasts are presenting extensive reports on today's reprisal raid against Jordan.

It was the first such raid for many months; I doubt whether it will be the last.

I happened to be in Tel Aviv this morning when the news broke, and it was easy enough to gauge the public's attitude toward the reprisal action, for it seemed to be the sole topic of conversation.

Over and over I heard the same statement: "It was about time."

Scarcely a day has gone by during the past few months without an act of Arab terrorism - usually a mining and occasionally an ambush.

The consequences: a few soldiers or civilians hospitalized or buried each week.

These may have been insignificant by Vietnam standards.

But these are consequences which we cannot accept indefinitely, partic-, ularly since the terrorists are certain to become bolder if they find they can kill without hindrance.

The incident which finally triggered off the reprisal raid took place the previous day near the Jordanian border.

Three teenage soldiers were killed and another six wounded when their car passed over a newly-laid mine. This was too much for our leaders and certainly too much for our citizens, who were fed up with the endless and useless protests to the United Nations.

They demanded action . . . and got it.

I only wish I were convinced that this raid, or another two raids, or

perhaps another five raids would end the terror.

They may have this effect, if the great powers also exert pressure on the Arab Governments.

But one may doubt the deterrent value of the raids alone since these governments, and particularly the clandestine terrorist groups, are not overly concerned at the possibility of a few of their fellow Arabs being killed.

On this side of the border, in any case, every death is somehow a personal matter.

If you don't know the person who lost his life, then you at least know someone like him.

Every street has its Moshe Klagsbrun, one of the three young soldiers killed in the command car.

Moshe, a quiet, talented technician, was born in a displaced persons camp in Germany in 1947 after his parents had miraculously escaped the gas chambers. He died a few days after his 19th birthday on a dusty desert road in Israel.

If you have a relative in the forces, and almost everyone has, there have been many particularly anxious hours of late.

As I write, it has been announced that one Israeli soldier was killed and six were wounded in the reprisal raid, but their names have not yet been released.

So Adeerah decided to call up her cousins to find out whether they had heard from their son, who is serving in a unit likely to have been involved in the raid.

They were grateful for the call, but they had no information.

I only hope that in thirteen or fourteen years' time we will not be waiting for news about the whereabouts of our son.
