

BONN (WNS) The neo-Nazi National Democratic Party, whose recent election gains in Bavaria and Hesse have alerted the world to the potential resurgence of right-wing extremism in Germany, is planning to spread out its tentacles to university campuses where it hopes to enlist many students.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (WNS) One of the highest ranking Soviet diplomats in Washington has indicated that the Soviet Union is interested in tranquility along the Israeli-Arab borders, it was disclosed here by Ambassador Joseph Tekoah, a member of Israel's delegation to this year's General Assembly.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Leftist demonstrators, mostly students paraded before the U.S. Embassy here demanding an end to the war in Vietnam.

NEW YORK (WNS) The Jews and the police "are the only whites who have not entirely deserted the ghetto" and he is "deeply ashamed" of anti-Jewish feelings in the Negro community, it was declared by the noted Negro leader Bayard Rustin at a session of the national executive committee of the Jewish Labor Committee."
