Eshkol Appeals to Johnson on Gravity in Middle East

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israel and Syria are to hold talks over the border tension with the Mixed Armistice Commission for the first time in eight years.

The commission plans to hold two meetings, the first one on the Syrian side of the international B'not Yaacov Bridge and the second on the Israeli side.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Israel has agreed to participate in an extraordinary meeting of

the Syrian-Israeli Mixed Armistice Commission, but it will not allow Syria "to run amok" if the meeting fails. According to Premier Levi Eshkol, who previously declared this could well be "a week of decision." Israel is willing to employ all political means to avoid conflict, but if Syrian aggres-

Dorothy Entratter, a vivacious woman and mother of two daughters, passed away several years ago at the very young age of 40.

Her husband, Jack Entratter, who is President of the Sands Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, and also President of Temple Beth Shalom in that city, took a solemn vow that Dorothy's memory shall live on.

Because of Dorothy's deep concern and unbinding love for children, Mr. Entratter went to Israel five years

ago and established a nursery school and an orphan home in the poverty-stricken area of Jerusalem. Jack dedicated the two modest structures as DOROTHY'S HOMES so as to perpetuate his wife's name.

In Israel--covering the Eichmann trial at that time--I personally visited DOROTHY'S HOMES. Though tragedy surely touched the orphans, they seemed to find some comfort in the knowledge that their new home
