For people who can just about get one solid thing accomplished in a week, it is a source of endless amazement how others can do so much.

I stand in awe, for example, of a rabbi named Rudolph Brasch. He's now in Australia, and when you read his life's story you would think that just staying alive would have kept him busy. He was a Nazi victim, then toiled in London during the Blitz, He's been in Ireland and in South Africa and now has a large, fasionable temple in

But, while coping with fate, this rabbi has managed to acquire more information than an army of researchers and has produced one book after another.

A Jewish savant, Dr. Brasch, in one of his books, described the significance of each Hebrew letter. Each one has a story, you know, and some meaning.

But in addition to Jewish lore, Dr. Brasch has mopped up general information and he has packed much of it in a new book called "How Did It Begin?"

You wouldn't believe that a rabbi could have accumulated all the intriguing data in that book.

In 350 pages, Dr. Brasch tells the source of superstitions associated with salt, the number 13, knocking on wood, four-leafed clover, horseshoes, mirrors, ladders, black cats, rabbit feet and more. Another chapter deals with what you might call Romanceana; kissing, rings, wedding rites, etc. But there are 25 chapters in all, each one more enlightening than the next. You learn about handshaking, dietary laws, wigs, beards, white elephants, magic, medicine, flags, military taboos, the calendar, and religious notions (from headcovering to the Star of David), What a delicious book! You can dip into it at any time.
