## WASHINGTON LETTER

The Honorable Ogden R. Reid served as United States Ambassador to Israel from 1959 to 1961.

In 1962, he was elected to the House of Representatives by his constituents of the 26th District in Westchester County, New York.

However, Cong. Reid, a Republican, has not forgotten the commitment he was part of when the United States assured Israel of this country's support in her terrirotial integrity and political independence,

Nor, has the handsome and unassuming 41-year old Congressman forgotten the Hebrew language which he diligently studied during his two-year tenure in Israel, Often, when addressing Jewish audiences, he opens his remarks in Hebrew.

Mr. Reid, now in his third term in Congress, is particularly concerned with the present conflict in the Middle East.

During an exclusive interview over lunch at the George Washington Hotel in New York City, Rep. Reid stressed that the United States must stand fully behind the Tripartite agreement, which includes Great Britian and France as guarantors.

(Senator Everett M. Dirkson (R.III.), Minority Leader of the Senate, during his State of the Union -- a Republican Appraisal, stated:

"As regards the Middle East, let me propose that the United States take the initiative in reconvening the conference of the Tripartite Guarantee Powers, and that these Powers -- the U.S., The United Kingdom, and France-use this new conference to reaffirm their 'unalterable opposition to the use of force or threat of force' in the Arab-Israel area and revive their pledge to preserve the frontiers and armistice lines in the Middle East.")

During our interview, Cong. Reid revealed, for the first time, his proposal that the United States facilitate Israel's entry into the European Common Market as an associate member, or to obtain a preferential trade agreement with the Common Market as a significant assist to her economic problems,

He also suggests serious talks be held between the Soviet Union and the United States, he said, as the key to lowering tensions in the Middle East. He feels that such high level - and secret - talks, would definitely reduce the tension.

Rep. Reid advocates the defusing of the tense situation on the Arab-Israel borders, including a strengthening of United Nations Truce Supervisory Organization (UNTSO)


