JERUSALEM (WNS) Lt. General Odd Bull, Chief of Staff of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization, has announced indefinite postponement of the fourth meeting of the Israel-Syrian Mixed Armistice Commission, ostensibly be-

cause of Syrian negotiators resisted his pleas not to raise issues outside of the agreed agenda.

The official agenda, as suggested by UN Secretary General U Thant, was limited to the question of cultivation rights in the demilitarized zone on the border of the two countries, but the Syrians insisted on raising collateral issues.

The first meeting was held on January 25, with both sides making formal statements on cultivation in the demilitarized zone, which is part of Israel. At the second session, held on January 29, the Syrians refused to abide

The Senator went on to say that he had visited the Dorothy Entratter Homes during his recent trip to Israel and that he can state first hand, that Jack's mission there is a wonderful one.

"It's a tremendous monument to Dorothy," he added, "and a noble cause for all concerned."

Entratter, President of the Sands Hotel in Las Vegas and President of that city's Temple Beth Sholom, took to the 'stage' and thanked his friends for making the evening such a meaningful one.

"It's the first time I've come to you for anything," he humbly said, "and your presence here tonight will

surely make the difference for many children. As a result, many little ones will be made much happier as they grow up, and will grow up as finer individuals."

Five years ago, the Dorothy Entratter Children's Nursery Homes in Israel were founded by Jack Entratter to perpetuate the memory of his wife. At first, two Nursery Homes were established. One, in Arnona, a Jerusalem suburb; A 'sleep-in' with a home life atmosphere -- this home cares for orphans from all sections of the State of Israel.

Good Old N.J. Anti-Semitism

WAYNE TOWNSHIP, N.J. (WNS) This community's 2,000 Jews, pondering the defeat of two Jewish candidates for the school 1 board in an election marred by anti-Semitism and bitter recrimination, are grimly asking "what next?"

The two Jewish candidates, Jack Mandell and Robert Kraus, wound up at the bottom of the list of five candidates for the vacancies on the board, each receiving slightly over 3,000 votes. The school board vice president Newton Miller, who had urged their defeat on the ground the "most Jews are liberals, especially when it comes to spending money for education," had the satisfaction of having had one of his supporters win a post on the board with the second

highest number of votes.

Miller's opposition to the "liberal Jews" was ostensibly based on their backing of an \$8,500,000 school budget, David Caliri, a Christian, received the highest vote of all the candidates. Defeat of the budget led to threats of mass resignations by teachers and other school personnel.

In addition, Miller also warned that Jewish majority on the board would destroy "what is left of the Christ in our Christian celebrations in the schools." This statement triggered deep resentment in the Jewish community from other sources. One board member, Mrs. Loraine Yoder, a Christian woman, said "Wayne was on trial before the nation and, (Continued on Page 8)
