

PHILADELPHIA (WNS) Samuel H. Daroff, a leading Jewish communal figure in this city and an active participant in Jewish philanthropic endeavors throughout the country, died here at the age of 68 at the Albert Einstein Medical Center, of which he was president and board chairman.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Isaac Hamlin, founder and first national secretary of the National Committee for Labor Israel and one of the most prominent leaders in the Labor Zionist movement, died here at his home at the age of 75.

LONDON (WNS) Exhumation and reburial of the skeletons of 2,000 Jews who were murdered by the Nazis during the occupation of the Baku area of the Soviet Union has been disclosed in a report from Moscow which said that the grim task was performed by Baku Jews and non-Jews. Most of the victims had been Polish Jews who fled to what they thought would be haven from Nazi entrapment in the Soviet Union.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A group of Arab Israeli writers who met with Nobel Prize winner Shmuel Y. Agnon have informed the Hebrew writer that his works would appear in Arabic translation later with the view of bringing a better understanding between Jew and Arabs.

5TH ANNUAL GUN SHOW AT SAHARA

The greatest display of Colt firearms in history will be assembled at Hotel Sahara this weekend for the hotel's 5th annual Mid-Winter Antique Gun Show.

The Colt collections of more than 100 exhibitors plus rare firearms of various other designs and special section devoted to modern weapons make the 1967 Sahara Mid-Winter the most ambitious show in the five-year history of the resort's arms display promotions.

Show Director Harry Mann of Las Vegas has set show hours from 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday and Saturday and 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Sunday in the Sahara Convention Center South. Presentations of awards will be made at 2:30 Sunday.

Hottest competition is expected to be in the area of "Best Individual Early Colt Arm of Show." Entries in this category include an authenticated 1851 Navy Colt revolver once owned by Jefferson Davis and a Pearson-Colt revolver--perhaps the oldest known--made by a Hartford, Conn., gunsmith for Col. Samuel Colt some four years before Colt opened his Paterson, N.J., factory in 1936.

Dr Roy S. Horton, Santa Ana, Calif., will exhibit one of a pair of Capt. Samuel Walker-Colts in 1846 US-Mexico war fame. Value of the weapon is placed near \$20,000!

Singer-actor Mel Torme also will be in contention for the best individual Colt award with an original Bunt-

as far as I am concerned, it convicted itself." Among the ugly aspects of the pre-election days were anti-Semitic phone calls and threats to Jewish residents, particularly the two Jewish candidates.

Meanwhile confusion still reigns in this town of 45,000, with opinion sharply divided on the degree to which actual anti-Semitism figured in the election results. Some residents feel a more potent factor may have been simple resentment at Mandell because his conflict with Miller, a former friend, touched off an explosion of charges and counter-charges that drew wide notoriety in the community and served to place it in the front pages of metropolitan newspapers. However, the large vote for Caliri appears to be one of the most puzzling aspects in the episode, since it apparently indicated that approval for Miller's fiscal viewpoint was not a sole factor in the voting pattern. This development is being viewed here by many Jews and non-Jews as an indisputable indication that bigotry played a chief role in the voting.

While some Jewish residents here felt that the issue had been over-dramatized, others were of the opinion that "bringing the issue out

in the open" was useful in this town, which has had a long history of ultra-conservatism. At one time restrictive covenants barred Jews from owning property here. Although there is division in the Jewish community on the handling of the issue, there is general agreement that the episode brought to the surface the subterranean anti-Semitism that had largely been overlooked in recent years. The one certainty, most observers conceded, is that group hostility has been greatly sharpened and the Christian-Jewish conflict will not simmer down soon.

Acting to stem the tide of divisiveness, Mayor Sisco, a Protestant whose father was a Catholic and whose sister is a convert to Judaism, issued a Brotherhood Week proclamation in the hope that the observance will serve to restore amity and tranquility to the township. At the same time however major national Jewish organizations are keeping an eye on the situation, hopeful that the Wayne incident will not trigger similar developments in other newly-developed suburban areas.
