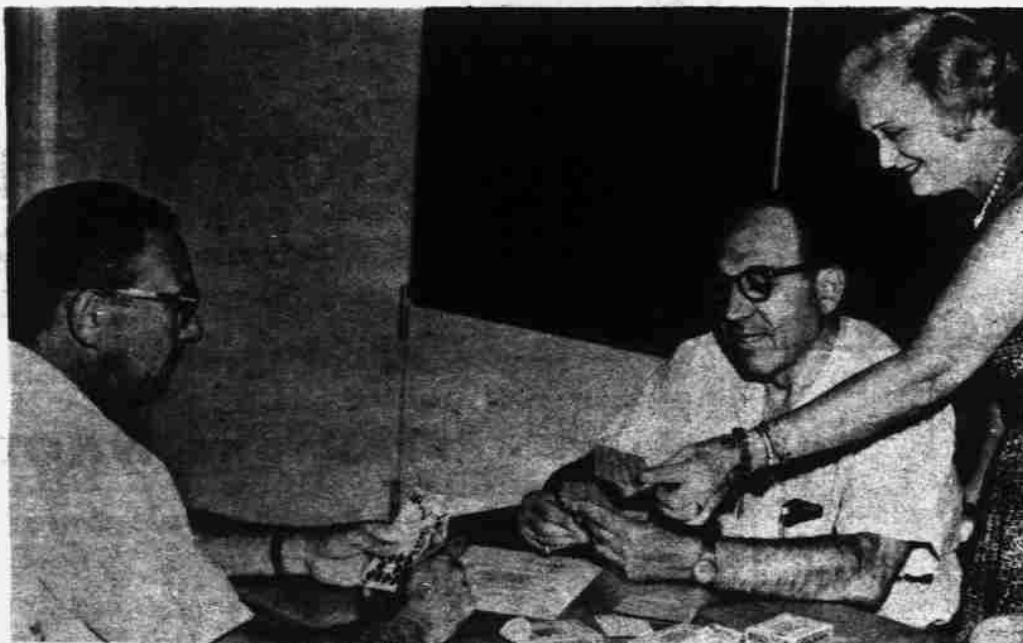
AZA-BBG SERVICE TONIGHT

Harry Herst, a solid citizen of the Jewish Community and a member of Temple Beth Sholom for the past 18 years, died Sunday, Feb. 26, 1967. He served as a member of the Men's Club Board of Directors.

A general contractor, Harry built the home occupied by Rabbi Gold and family, and according to Harry Wallerstein, Temple Pres. at the time, Herst's cooperation saved the Temple many thousands of dollars.
