

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) Lt. General Odd Bull, chief of staff of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization, was scheduled to meet here with officials of the Israeli Foreign Ministry in an effort to have the suspended Syrian-Israeli talks resumed if possible.

While the truce chief was centering his attention on the Israel-Syrian situation, Jordanian border troops shot and wounded two Israeli border guards in a four-hour exchange that was halted by Jordan only after three cease fire orders. The skirmish developed when the Jordanians opened fire on Israeli surveyors.

MUNICH (WNS) Imposition of prison terms ranging from five to fifteen years on three Nazi officials convicted of involvement in the slaying of 90,000 Dutch Jews has renewed speculation in the Jewish community of Germany about the adequacy of punishment for war criminals in German courts.

NEW YORK -- An exhibit of recent American Judaica arranged by the Jewish Book Council of the National Jewish Welfare Board will be featured at the 3rd Jerusalem International Book Fair, to be held March 28-April 5, 1967 in Jerusalem's Convention Hall.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Regulations for payments of allowances to the jobless in Israel were approved by a Ministerial Economic Committee of the Cabinet following earlier disclosure by Minister of Labor Yigal Allon that 96,000 of the total labor force of 855,000 in the country were unemployed.

SAO PAULO (WNS) Acting on an extradition request by the Austrian government, government officials in Brazil ordered the arrest of Franz Stangl, commandant of the notorious Treblinka death camp in Poland and associate in Nazi crimes in the Madanek and Sobibor death enclaves.

MANCHESTER (WNS) Despite sharp protests by Jewish and non-Jewish groups here, the producers of the Obergmmergau Passion Play put the show on display.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., (WNS) Albert W. Golomb, former publisher of the American Jewish Outlook, English-Jewish weekly of Pittsburgh, died here at the age of 63.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) A survey of fifty-nine private country and city clubs in Southern California has shown that forty five percent of them are practicing membership discrimination on religious and racial grounds.

NEW YORK -- Nearly 400 publications covering virtually all aspects of American Jewish life are included in the new Catalog of Publications and Other Resources, just published by the National Jewish Welfare Board, as part of its Golden Jubilee celebration.

Airlines plane were many leading Jewish religious and communal leaders who later gathered at the airports international synagogue, where the former Israeli Premier was encountered by a barrage of newsmen. Included in the group that greeted the famed citizen of Sdeh Boker in Israel were Avraham Harman, Israeli Ambassador to the U.S., Edward Ginsberg of Cleveland, associate general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, Rabbi Herbert A. Friedman, executive vice-chairman of the UJA, and Michael Arnon, Israel's Consul-General in New York.

At the International Synagogue there was an overflow assembly of more than four-hundred people. There the distinguished guest was greeted by Mr. Ginsberg and Rabbi Israel Mowshovitz, chaplain and chairman of the synagogue board.

Addressing the congregants in the synagogue, Mr. Ben Gurion lauded the four U.S. Presidents who had been in the White House since Israel's emergence in 1948 "for the help they have extended to us on behalf of the American people." From the first, Mr. Ben Gurion went on, "Americans everywhere have understood Israel's democratic hopes and ambitions" and "on every level they have been our warm supporters and friends."
