

REPORT FROM CARSON CITY

As we near the time when siderable portion of the exthe regular session time limit of 60 days will run out, we find that the major decisions of the session are still ahead of us. As usual, the biggest decision which will lead to the closing of the session is the financing problem.

It now appears that we are faced with a revenue gap of over \$12,000,000 per year and this can be overcome only by substantial revenue increases in some of the taxing fields available to the state. This revenue gap comes in the face of a "hold-the-line" budget and accompanies the public desire to be spared any major tax burden increase. However, the need for the added revenues comes from the demand of that same public for greater support for existing services and for part of the state. These demands are particularly noticed in the field of public

We estimate that we will need a minimum of \$6,000,-000 per year more than the Governor's budget recommends for support of the avoid turning away a con-

pected freshman class at the University, an additional \$1,-500,000 per year will be needed there. Because of revised estimates of case load and demand in various parts of the Governors budget it now seems quite likely that as much as \$3,000,000 per year will be needed to keep that budget balanced. And so it goes.

The major taxes being looked at are the gambling tax, where an increase of as much as 25% is being recommended, and the county-oforigin sales tax dedicated to the schools. Neither of these increases, particularly the latter, is simple to assess. It will probably take us well past the 60th day to work out the details.

Even then probably very few will be satisfied with the result. As those who are requesting the added funds will wind up with less than they have requested, and those who feel their tax burden is already too high will be paying even more. So far this legislature has not been able to devise a tax which raises substantial funds, not paid by the citizens of the state in some way.
