

concern the great need for more planning--longer than two years. The very real tragedy that the University is now involved in regarding the Northern Regents trying to get a medical school through comes in the face of no real long range -- 10 to 15 year -- plan for the University against which the medical school plan can be evaluated. The University's relations with the Legislature are extremely poor and the medical school issue does not help it any. It is a real task to set the medical school in perspective without further hindering the relationships between the University and the Legislature.

"As you know, I believe that an economy that is largely dependent on a single industry is living dangerously. I believe that we must look analytically at our resources and at the needs of industries and decide what industries are most in need of what we have to offer in Nevada, Having found those industries, we can then look for the companies within those industries that are ready and able to make a move to our state. This process of long range economic development has not been followed in our State's Department of Economic Development, but it is the Governor's intent that it shall do so now. I am happy to have been able to play a part in helping to formulate this plan and to help get support for it in the Legislature."
