WASHINGTON (WNS) The Supreme Court of the United States dismissed an appeal by a New York Orthodox Jew against his state's practice of designating churches as election polling places.

NEW YORK (WNS) The Joint Distribution Committee may receive up to \$1,000,000 in surplus machinery and equipment from the U.S. Government for use in developing countries.

TEL AVIV (WNS) The annual Jacob Landau prize was awarded by the local B'nai B'rith lodge to Isaac Rembah, veteran publicist and former editor of Herut, Hebrew daily.

REHOVOT (WNS) The Oxford University Press in London will publish in English the letters and archives of the late Dr. Chaim Weizmann, Israel's first President.

TEL AVIV (WNS) J.D. Berkowitz renowned Hebrew and Yiddish writer and son-in-law of the late Sholem Aleichem, died here-at the age of 81.

BONN(WNS) West Germany since 1945 has questioned 74,000 suspected Nazi war criminals and 6,179 of them have been sentenced to various prison terms, it was disclosed here by Bonn's Minister of Justice Gustave Heinemann.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Winter hotel rates in Israel will be cut by ten percent in a move to boost tourist trade.

REHOVOTH (WNS) Advanced methods of tracing underground water flow have been developed by researchers in the Isotope Research Department of the Weizmann Institute of Science, it was announced here by Dr. Joel Gat, acting head of the department.

JERUSALEM (WNS) More than 1,500 delegates and guests are expected to converge here for the 70th Jubilee Convention of the Zionist Organization of America when it opens on July 19.

NEW YORK (WNS) The current renaissance of interest in Yiddish as a language and culture "reflects a new appreciation for the treasures that were destroyed in the European holocaust," it was declared here by David Weintraub, music director of the Jewish Teachers Seminary.

JERUSALEM (WNS) Possibility of a breakthrough in Israel's relations with the pro-Soviet bloc of countries in Eastern Europe was seen with the announcement that one of Israel's top government official, Minister of Finance Pinhas Sapir, was heading an Israeli delegation to Bucharest this month.

MONTREAL (WNS) Government aid to Jewish schools as a means of solving the problem of high costs of education was urged here at the 27th annual meeting of the United Talmud Torahs of Montreal.
