

**SYRIAN AGGRESSION**

10. On 9 January, at 11:30 a.m. armed Syrians crossed the international border and penetrated into Israeli territory in the vicinity of Kibbutz Ha'on, southeast of the Lake of Galilee and opened fire. At 11:50 a.m. Syrian fortified positions at Tel-Hillal opened machinegun fire on Israeli territory near Ashmura. There were no casualties. At 12:35 p.m. Syrian tanks emplaced at the Syrian position of Tawfiq, southeast of the Lake of Galilee, started shelling at an Israeli tractor cultivating a field near Kibbutz Tel-Katzir. Israel returned with tank fire. Two Syrian tanks were destroyed.

11. On 10 January, four shooting incidents were reported. a) At 1:00 p.m. Syrian heavy machinegun fire was directed from their position at Tel Hillal against the Ashmura farm. b) At 1:20 p.m. the Syrian military position at Jalabina joined in shooting against the farm. c) At 1:25 p.m. heavy machinegun fire was directed from the Syrian military position at Tawfiq against a tractor cultivating the fields of Tel Katzir. d) At 2:15 p.m. machinegun fire was opened from Syrian military positions at Darbashiya against Notera village.

12. On 11 January, at 6:15 a.m. the Syrians opened fire against Israel territory from their military position at Ein-Tina; at 9:35 a.m. the Syrians directed machinegun fire from their position at Darbashiya against the village of Notera; at 12:36 p.m. again fire was directed from Darbashiya at Notera; at 3:30 p.m. the Syrians renewed their machinegun fire from Darbashiya at an Israeli routine patrol in the vicinity of Notera; at 3:55 p.m. the same Syrian position opened 82 mm mortar shelling against Notera; at 4:35 p.m. Syrian tanks emplaced at the position of Darbashiya started shelling Notera and adjacent fields; at 4:42 p.m. the Syrians directed heavy mortar fire (120 mm calibre) at the same targets. Tank fire was returned by Israel. As a result of the Syrian attacks, two Israelis were injured, one of them seriously. Two tractors were damaged and a shed containing agricultural equipment was hit. One Syrian tank of the T-34 type was destroyed.

13. On 14 January, at 6:15 p.m. machinegun fire was directed from the Syrian military positions at Nukeib and Kursi on the eastern shore of the Lake of Galilee at Israeli fishing boats. The Syrian fire lasted for 35 minutes.

14. On 15 January 1967 at 12:10 p.m. the Syrian military position at Nukeib opened machinegun fire at an Israeli patrol boat on the Lake.

15. On 16 January at 7:30 a.m. three anti-vehicle mines were discovered in a field of Tel-Katzir about 1 kilo-

meter from the Syrian border. Footprints led to the Syrian border.

16. On 13 February 1967, two Syrian soldiers penetrated into Israel territory in the northern demilitarized zone. At noon the Syrian position at Tel-Hamrah opened fire on an Israeli patrol. Defensive fire was returned from the Israel side.

17. On 14 February 1967 at 9:40 a.m. five Syrian soldiers penetrated Israeli territory in the northern demilitarized zone. At 10:30 a.m. the Syrian position at Tel-Hamrah opened fire on an Israeli patrol. The exchange of fire lasted 3/4ths of an hour. One Israeli soldier was injured.

18. On February 15 1967, at 3:00 p.m. the Syrian fortified position at Dar-Bashiyah fired at an Israeli tractor working on Israeli fields.

19. On 18 February at 8:45 p.m. an Israeli patrol intercepted a Syrian soldier who crossed the border in the Noterah-Dar-Bashiyah area. In the exchange of fire a Syrian soldier was killed.

20. On 2 April at 5:30 p.m. the Syrian fortified position at Amrat-Az-Adin opened continuous fire at an Israeli tractor of Kibbutz Ha'on on the southeast shore of the Lake of Galilee working in a field that has been under continuous cultivation.

21. On 3 April at 2:45 p.m. alternate fire from machine-guns and anti-tank guns was opened from the Syrian positions of Amrat-Az-Adin and Hirbet-Battin at a tractor of Kibbutz Ha'on. Israeli fire was returned.

22. On 7 April at 9:45 a.m. the Syrian position of Amrat-Az-Adin opened heavy machinegun fire at a tractor working in a field northeast of Kibbutz Ha'on. Syrian tanks deployed at Hirbet Battin started to shell the area. Several shells were exploded in the vicinity of Kibbutz Tel-Katzir. Syrian tanks deployed at the position of Hirbet Tawfiq opened fire. Israeli fire was returned.

At 11:10 a.m. Syrians added mortar shells aimed at the Israeli tractor. The U.N. suggested a cease-fire. Israel agreed to a mutual ceasefire at 11:30 a.m.

At 11:45 a.m. the exchange of fire in the area of Kibbutz Ha'on was halted. Five minutes later the Syrians opened heavy mortar fire at the Israeli tractor working in the field. In the exchange of fire one Israeli was wounded. Israeli fire hit and set afire a Syrian tank which was shelling the position at Hirbet-Battin.

At 1:30 p.m. Israeli air force planes were sent out to silence the Syrian positions at Hirbet Tawfiq and Amrat-Az-Adin which were firing continuously with heavy mortars and tank guns. Syrian fire was silenced. An air battle developed between Israeli Air Force Mirage fighters and Syrian Mig 21's which were trying to approach the Ha'on

of informed political circles, the move is believed to indicate fear of open admission of defeat and Israeli superiority in the air and on land despite the open-boasting of the Syrian President that Damascus was "determined to retaliate against aggression by destroying the bases and sources of the aggression." Other sources in Israel incline to the view that the Damascus decision to withdraw the complaint presaged Syrian intensification of its campaign of terror and sabotage against Israel.

In Israel, meanwhile, the clash has solidified public

opinion in support of the government determination to meet whatever crisis may emerge with proper force. The general feeling in the country is, as expressed by Chief of Staff Yitzhak Rabin, that Israel's armed forces have the strength to deal with the Syrians "in any form Israel finds fitting."

Israel after the fighting filed a complaint with the Security Council, without however asking for a meeting of the United Nations body. The complaint merely called attention to the "continued acts of aggression and provocation by Syrian armed forces." So far there have been no indications whether Israel planned added moves.

area. Two Mig 21's were shot down by the Israeli planes. No Israeli planes were hit.

At 2:55 p.m. four Syrian Mig 21's were trying to approach the Sea of Galilee area. Israeli planes were sent to intercept them. The Syrian planes retreated eastward.

At 3:00 p.m. the Syrian artillery started to shell Kibbutz Ein Gev on the eastern shore of the Sea of Galilee and Kibbutz Gadot, north of the Sea of Galilee. Israeli planes were sent to silence the Syrian artillery positions. All planes returned safely.

At 4:00 p.m. an air battle developed in the area between four Israeli Mirage planes and four Syrian Mig 21's. One Mig was shot down and the others retreated eastward. No Israeli plane was hit.

At 4:25 p.m. an air battle in the area of Tel Katzir, southeast of the Sea of Galilee, again between Israeli Mirages and Syrian Mig 21's developed. Three more Syrian Mig 21's were hit and shot down. The three were seen falling into Jordanian territory in the vicinity of the Yarmuk River. No Israeli plane was hit.
