Among the laws passed were increased gambling and sales taxes, easier divorces. expansion of Supreme Court to five justices, medical aid to poor and increased public school expenditures, two additional Clark County university regents, a medical school plan and requirement for voter approval of urban renewal projects.

Among proposed laws pending are restriction of Marrying Sams, car dealers required to close on Sundays, legislative budget control over university, permission for 18-year-olds to vote, tighter money controls over casinos, expansion of Black Book on undesirables, permission for corporations to be licensed for gambling, intermediate punishment for
