

REPORT FROM CARSON CITY

Senator Chic Hecht

It was a weary-sounding Sen. Chic Hecht, who phoned late Tuesday, indicating the long hours and strenuous effort being endured by our elected representatives in the waning days of this session, which probably will be adjourned by the time you are reading this edition.

The good senator gave us a quick rundown of enacted and pending legislation, and re-assured Israelite readers he would be available to clarify any and all business handled by the Nevada Senate during the 1967 meeting.

Among the laws passed were increased gambling and sales taxes, easier divorces, expansion of Supreme Court to five justices, medical aid to poor and increased public school expenditures, two additional Clark County university regents, a medical school plan and requirement for voter approval of urban renewal projects.

Among proposed laws pending are restriction of Marrying Sams, car dealers required to close on Sundays, legislative budget control over university, permission for 18-year-olds to vote, tighter money controls over casinos, expansion of Black Book on undesirables, permission for corporations to be licensed for gambling, intermediate punishment for

gambling violations and limiting gambling licenses.

Among legislation introduced but rejected were blanket repeal of casino entertainment tax, legal abortions, prohibition of topless cocktail waitresses, abolishment of death penalty, appointment (not election) of university regents.

In addition two enactments were passed but require approval of the 1969 legislature and the voters in the 1970 election. They are, a two-term limit for governor and annual legislative sessions (instead of two years.)
