#### NAZI RAT STANGL SAYS HE HAD NOT KILLED EVEN ONE JEW

RIO DE JANEIRO (WNS) Nazi war criminal Franz Stangl, whose extradition from Brazil is being sought by West Germany, Austria and Poland, was quoted by police officials here of having told them that he had not killed "even one Jew."

Moreover, the former commandant of the notorious Treblinka and Sobibor death camps was alleged to have claimed that he disobeyed orders by the head of the Lublin reservation, General Odilo Globrnik, Nazi chief of the Lublin reservation, to kill Jews.

Stangl has been held under arrest since March 2, when the Austrian Government asked for his extradition to stand trial as a war criminal. Later Poland asked for the criminal on the ground that Poland was the site of
