Passover Message from United Jewish Appeal

Passover is Judaism's testament to the great principle of human freedom. But it will be only those living in an atmosphere of freedom-as in our own country-for whom the retelling of the ancient Seder tale of liberation will hold any real meaning.

For more than 800,000 Jewish men, women and children the world over, the festival of Passover will serve as a reminder of their own unfulfilled hopes for freedom from want, insecurity and fear. These freedoms are being denied to scores of thousands of Jews in the Moslem lands who are dependent on UJA aid, and to thousands of uprooted Jews who cannot make their way of havens of freedom in Israel and other lands without the aid of the UJA. This situation even prevails among the hundreds of thousands of unabsorbed immigrants whom we brought to Israel. That little coun-

try, imperiled by hostile neighbors, suffering from a severe economic recession, cannot hope to provide the housing, the welfare services, medical care, educational facilities and job training that her newcomers require before they can reap the opportunities of freedom without massive assistance from the UJA.

Through their support of the UJA nationwide campaign for \$75,620,000, American Jews can make gifts of hope and freedom to those who have yet to be brought forth from their many "Egypt" as well as those we have brought to the threshold of a new life in Israel. I know that, as always, they will respond to our appeal with the kind of generosity so characteristic of the members of the American Jewish community.
