With the establishment of the State of Israel, many Americans have followed the Israeli practice and given their children Hebrew names which are common in Israel. Here are a few of these: - Zahava, gold; Yaffa, pretty; Tziporah, a bird; Lavana, moon; Rina and Gila, joy; and Dafna, a laurel.

If you are at a loss for some Hebrew names, here are a few common ones, but ones which certainly carry beauty and significance for the Jewish people, both historically and culturally.

For example, David in Hebrew means beloved. And one who does not know the story of King David, the mighty warrior and poet of Israel. Or Deborah, which in Hebrew means a bee, was also a mighty warrior of Israel; or Isaac, Abraham's son, which in Hebrew means laughter, And of course, Moses, drawn from the river.

Before we go on with more names, we must note that since Biblical days, it has become customary and wide spread to switch male and female names, in modern Jewish life, it may be a problem when one has to name a new born child after a grandparent of the opposite sex. Here are a few switches: Dan and Dina, Chaim and Haya; Uri and Orah; Yona and Yonina, Yehuda and Yehudit; Tzvi and Tzvia and Shlomo and Shlomit,

Many Israelis name their children after one of the 12 tribes of Israel: Dan, Benjamin, Reuben, Gad, Simeon, Menashe, Judah, Zebulun, Naphtali, Asher, Issachar and
