Jordan U.S. Envoy Slams Israel

The Jordanian ambassador to the United States delivered a severe indictment of the state of Israel at a World Affairs Week plenary session Tuesday night.

Farhan Shubeilat said that Israel as a political state is a threat to Arabs. "We have nothing against the Jews as far as race or religion. We have nothing against Jews who do not support the Zionist movement."

"IT IS clearly a political movement and we are against it," he said.

Mr. Shubeilat said that the Arabs object to the great influx of foreigners who have settled in Palestine since World War I. The problem does not lie in the fact that Jews were already there, he said.

"There were more than 60,000 Jews in Palestine in 1917, out of a population of 800,000. In 1947, there were more than 700,000 Jews. Now there are more than two million and they are still seeking more, without looking at what the capacity might be."

The ambassador decried the fact that the Arabs are being forced to deal with a problem created by other nations.

Mr. Shubeilat said that the persecutions in Europe and Russia created problems for the Arabs by increasing the flow of Jews to Palestine. "We were the people to pay the price for all these prob-

lems," he said.

"It was like not being able to vote on an issue when you are absent from class."

"WE HAVE the right to be against people who are not of our race; people who have no relation to our area; people who take ten times their share. What did we do?"

To the misfortune of the Arabs, Mr. Shubeilat said, early in the century the numbers of Jews in the United States grew because of an exodus from Russia. They eventually made themselves felt in the form of a pressure group.

They exerted pressure on the President, he said, to allow 100,000 refugees to enter Palestine and to favor partition of the country. "Truman confessed he was under great pressure to take the side of the Zionists," Mr. Shubeilat said.

The decision was made to divide Palestine. The two parts were to be linked economically. "The Zionists were preparing long ago for the fight," he said. "They took more than they were given. Israel was established by the division of Arabs and by the support of those who came to fight because they were paid very highly."

"WE SEEK security. We want peace. How to do it?"

"We are not interested in fighting. We don't want to kill. But we don't want to be killed," Mr. Shubeilat said.

SPEECH CAUSES REACTION

A World Affairs Conference speech made Wednesday by the Jordanian ambassador to the United States produced a strong reaction from at least one other participant in the conference.

Sam Rosenberg, a freelance journalist, film producer and documentary director, said Ambassador Farhan Shubeilat should not be allowed to make blatant anti-Semitic statements and then fly back to Washington before anyone has a chance to answer him.

"THE STATEMENT of the ambassador as reported in the Colorado Daily," Mr. Rosenberg said, "implies that Russian Communist Jews pressured the U.S. government to allow 100,000 Jewish refugees into Palestine."

"This is a Hitlerian ploy designed to camouflage the real historical facts."

Mr. Rosenberg covered the 1948 Arab-Israeli war and was in Israel when they gained nationhood that year.

"I'm not speaking as a journalist," he said, "But as a participant in this conference who is also a Jew."

He said he was not trying to debate the facts with Ambassador Shubeilat -- that wasn't the point. He was merely objecting to a process that would allow the Jordanian Ambassador to go unanswered.
