table with Julie Christie, last year's Oscar winner; Mrs. Alex North, wife of "Virginia Wolf's" accomplished Jewish composer; her 15-year-old daughter Elissa; Jack Warner, industry leader; Walter MacEwen, Warner's vice president in charge of feature production; and Max Bercutt, studio publicity chief.

Micro-skirted Julie, thin-faced, with scraggly, stringy hair that at one time dipped into her bouillabaisse, whispered and giggled with girl friend Diane Jones. She looked and acted like a teenager, belying by appearance and actions her star status, yet always reminding that she won last year's femme actress Oscar by making her portrayals come alive with forcefulness and conviction.

Young actors and unknowns crowded around our table, squeezing behind Julie to position themselves craftily and steal into her pictures while dozens of photographers fired their strobes.

Publicity director Max Bercutt played running guard, bouncing the phonies who would hitch their wagons to a star. Meanwhile, like a dotting father, Jack Warner kept pushing Julie's stringy hair out of her eyes but each

time Julie pushed it right back.

Sherlee North, representing her absentee nominee husband, who failed to win an Oscar, advised that Alex was busy in Munich recording a symphony for a 3-1/2 hour ABC documentary on Africa. Elissa plays classical guitar and believes she has inherited her father's talent.

While we were talking, Elissa exclaimed, "Oh, mother, the orchestra is playing dad's Virginia Wolf's score!" Which is a teenage mod's improvement over our hackneyed adult expression, "Honey! They're playing our song!"

DON'T MISS the movie "Thoroughly Modern Millie," if for only one good Jewish reason: the wedding dance scenes.

Observe the orchestra carefully. The little mustached fellow playing clarinet at the left is Mickey Katz, who, given half a chance, will point with pride, not to his own theatrical accomplishments, but to those of his equally gifted son, Joel Gray, star of Broadway's "Cabaret" and recent winner of a Tony award.

Nobody plays a froelich better than Mickey. Other members of his film orchestra evidence equal facility with Jewish musical lore.

The most interesting part of this movie for Jewish audiences are the wedding guests who gather on the floor for the tradition dances. You've seen their ilk at dozens of weddings.
