

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK, Pornography and censorship, neo-Nazism, and civic disobedience are among current social issues created in lively dialogue on "Encounter," a new radio series released by the American Jewish Committee and the Office of Communication of the United Church of Christ. The Rev. Truman B. Douglass, New York, executive vice president of the United Church Board for Homeland Ministries, and Morris B. Abram, New York, president of the American Jewish Committee, talk in the series about the ethical decisions that must be made by all Americans.

GENEVA: The Joint Distribution Committee has concluded an agreement with the Polish authorities for the construction of two new homes for the aged, one in Cracow and one in Wroclaw, it was announced by Charles H. Jordan, JDC Executive Vice-Chairman.

JERUSALEM (WNS) President Zalman Shazar extended the hand of peace to the bordering Arab states, in a message on the occasion of Israel's celebration of its 19th year of independence.

DETROIT (WNS) Although officials of the General Motors Corporation denied the company had discriminated against a Jewish employee, it took steps to redress his complaint to the Michigan Civil Rights Commission that he had been subject to bias on the job.

JERUSALEM (WNS) A sizeable section of King Solomon's palace at Meggido, 18 miles southeast of Haifa, has been uncovered by a large-scale archaeological expedition under the direction of Yigael Yadin, Hebrew University Professor of Archaeology, and former Israel Chief of Staff of the armed forces. Also brought to light was an old city wall of the famous Jewish monarch. The palace was described as Syro-Phoenician in architectural style and part of its walls are almost seven feet thick.

NEW YORK (WNS) Charles H. Jordan, executive vice-chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee and chairman of the Commission on Refugees of the International Council of Voluntary Agencies was honored at a testimonial luncheon attended by 200 social workers.

NEW YORK (WNS) A widely-touted book about the Treblinka concentration camp by the 29-year-old son of a Jewish father and a Christian mother, which is featured in the current issue of The Saturday Evening Post, drew the sharp denunciation of Alexander Donat, a survivor of the Warsaw Ghetto and five concentration camps.

NEW YORK (WNS) Dr. John Slawson, widely known Jewish communal leader and for the past 24 years the executive vice-president of the American Jewish Committee, announced his retirement this week.

NEW YORK (WNS) The Jewish Theological Seminary will award the Louis Marshall Distinguished Service Medal to Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller.

NEW YORK (WNS) An effort to break the barrier that exists between the white Jewish community and the estimated 10,000 black Jews in the United States is not under way, according to the chairman of the Student Zionist Organization here. Andy Reutlinger, a student at Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute, said his group is working with Hatzaad Harishon, an organization of multi-racial Jews seeking to bring Jewish religious and cultural education to the black Jewish community of America.

NEW YORK (WNS) U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Arthur Goldberg was host at a reception honoring Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress; distinguished Jewish historian Dr. Cecil Roth, and Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz, vice president of the Israel Bond Organization. The three were honored for their association with the Encyclopedia Judaica, a 15-volume compendium that will appear in 1970. Dr. Goldmann is president of The Judaica Research Foundation; Prof. Roth is the Encyclopedia's editor-in-chief; and Dr. Schwartz is the president of the foundation.

NEW YORK (WNS) The Association of Orthodox Jewish Scientists has entered the controversy over autopsies in Israel, an issue that has resulted in contention that nearly wrecked the government coalition, with a policy statement for Premier Eshkol, asking that the Israel government clearly "vest permission for autopsy in the hands of the family of the deceased," and that all hospitals, doctors and religious leaders cooperate toward this end.
