From Cleveland it was Washington, D. C. and a reunion with Vice President Humphrey at the Washington Hilton Hotel, where he was being honored with the annual humanitarian award of Histadrut, an Israeli-American labor group. It was a \$50.00 per person affair.

Most of the Vice President's hour long speech was devoted to civil-rights. I will recall how he talked on matters of that some twenty years ago, when he was running for Mayor of Minneapolis and later Senator of Minnesota.

Turning to civil rights, Humphrey said that "a good many white Americans are saying to themselves nowadays: 'Haven't they got enough? What more do they want?'"

The answer, according to Humphrey, is that they want to be "equal citizens, nothing less and nothing more."

"In twenty years of public life I have tried to serve as a voice and a worker for the cause of equal justice and equal opportunity, for the welfare, and for the common defense of our country. In all those years I have never felt tryly alone. I have always been aware of the innate good sense and good will of America people.

"I have never doubted America and its people. And I have faith in the future of mankind. There is a common yearning for peace, for human dignity, for individual

fulfillment, that breaches the artificial barriers of nations, creeds and political philosophies."

Mr. Humphrey continued: "The press in this country, as in no other country, is the honest watchdog of the people. It is not a one-party press, or a big-city press, or an Eastern press, or a controlled press. I am always suspicious when someone blames his troubles on the press. Man forms his own image. The mirror is seldom faulty."

About Labor Union Officials: "I like to be considered a friend of labor, just as I like to be considered pro-people, or pro-peace, or pro free enterprise. And I think the cause of each is intertwined."

The Younger Generation: "If this nation is to continue as the leader of the world, we must make sure that our children are trained and educated to live in this age of scientific revolution.

"One third of our present population was born between 1946 and 1962. We must be prepared to fully utilize these young men and women in our society, and to give them every opportunity for their individual fulfillment."

The Histadrut Humanitarian Award is the highest honor bestowed by the National Committee for Labor Israel and the American Trade Union Council for His-

The millions of people who have met and heard this great humanitarian will agree that our nation and world will someday rate him among the greatest.
